He said fute can also meet the world demand of pulp and paper. "With a goal-oriented research, jute could play a good role for the economy", he stated.

Dr Hussain stressed the need for setting up a "jute commission" consisting of government officials, overseas experts, growers and jute traders as well as persons from jute industries. He said that their recommendations should be implemented at the earliest possible time to help the growers in the next jute growing season.

Dr Hussain said that continuous technological research and extension work had to be carried out to solve the problems of jute industry.

Earlier, in his address of welcome, Executive Vice-Chairman of BARC. Dr M Sujaetullah Chowdhury said the farmers should be given incentives and support in growing jute. He underscored the environmental merits of jute and jute goods and said, "more private sector interest should be drawn to the development of the sector."

Sugar authorities prefer polythene tojute

CHITTAGONG, Dec 10 Bangladesh Sugar and Food Industries Corporation (BSFIC) has suggested replacing jute bags with polythene laminated Hessian bags for packing sugar and other food items, a Jute Ministry source said here, reports UNB.

It will involve an additional expenditure of Tk 4.50 crore for about 42 lakh bags this season to pack 2.8 lakh tons of sugar, the production target of the season, the source said

Each bag, costing Tk 31.21, can contain of 50 kg sugar but the jute bags used by BSFIC at present can hold 100 kg cal and costs Tk 21.24 each.

BSFIC has already sent a proposal for 15 lakh polythene laminated bags to the Jute Ministry, the source said.

BSFIC officials said the decision to use polythene laminated bags was taken in order to protect sugar from melting in the humid air.
