Work of Ctg city embankment project to begin in March

CHITTAGONG, Dec 12: The physical work of Chittagong City Protection Embankment Project worth Taka 65 crore will begin in March next year, reports BSS.

Planning Minister A M Zahiruddin Khan was apprised of the project by Water Development Board at a review meeting held Thursday.

The project provides for construction of 18.63 km coastal embankment on permanent basis to protect Chittagong Airport Export Processing Zone, Chittagong Steel Mills, Naval Base, Chittagong Port and other important installations of the port city.

Later, the minister visited some industrial units at the EPZ to see the working conditions there. Sirajuddin, Planning Commission Member, BEPZA Board Chairman Syed Shahabuddin Ahmed and Member (Engg) A A M Zia Hussain and the DC A R Khan were present during his visit to EPZ today.

Pragmatic food policy a must for alleviation of poverty

CHITTAGONG, Dec 12: Planning Minister A M Zahiruddin Khan today underlined the importance of formulating a more pragmatic and rational food policy for alleviating poverty in rural Bangladesh, reports BSS.

"Bangladesh food policies are intimately related to the overall economy in general and the welfare of both consumers and producers, in particular the low-income disadvantage groups, the minister said while addressing the concluding ceremony of a 16-day training course on 'Basic food policy' as the chief guest at a city hotel.

Organised by International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI), the inauguration ceremony was presided over by

Ataul Haq, Secretary, Ministry of Food and addressed, among others, by Dr Harold I Ritt I Rice, chief of party, IFPRI, A H Mohammad Shamsul Alam, Director of Food and Dr Francesca Goietti, representative of IFPRI, Washington.

Mayor of Chittagong City Corporation Mir Mohammad Nasiruddin was present on the occasion as the special guest.

The minister said the present democratic government called for new policies supported by the electorate favouring greater equity and human resource development.

Zahiruddin hoped that after successful completion of this training course the participants would do their best in the field of food and agriculture.

The Mayor, in his speech, said the government had attached highest importance of being self-reliant in foodgrains but due to frequent natural calamities the goal had not yet been achieved. He however, pointed out that as government provided adequate agricultural inputs and incentives to the farmers significant progress had been made in foodgrains production in recent years.

The present government's programme of canal digging is an effort in that direction, he added.

Later, the minister gave away the certificates among 30 participants from a number of important organisations and agencies.

In a press release signed by its Secretary General Denis Dilip Datta said that December 25 is the holy day for the Christians. If the jute and textile workers observed their blockade programme the observance of Christmas Day would be hampered, he added.

Short Film Forum

Bangladesh Short Film Forum on Thursday expressed concern over the ban on 'Dhushar Jatra' directed by Abu Syed.

Film Censor Board on November 17 imposed ban on the film terming it a threat to country's sovereignty and unity. The Forum said the film is based on the spirit of the War of Independence. It demanded issuance of censor certificate by December 16.

Sexually transmitted diseases on rise

Creation of public awareness suggested

The week-long workshop on Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD) that ended in Dhaka Thursday suggested expansion of diagnostic and treatment facilities and creation of public awareness for control and prevention of the diseases in Bangladesh, reports BSS.

The workshop also suggested identification and surveillance of risk groups through routine reporting from the Upazila Health Complexes, sentinel reporting from the government STD clinics and sentinel survey in the brothels and other high risk groups.

Jointly sponsored by the Directorate of Health Services and the World Health Organization (WHO), the objectives of the workshop were to develop a surveillance system in high risk areas and prepare a plan of action for prevention and control of STD in the country.

Considering the rising trends of incidences of STD it recommended expanding the diagnosis and treatment facilities at the district level and improving the existing facilities at the different medical college hospitals, the IPGMR and some other places.

The workshop observed that due to lack of information,

the actual situation of STD in Bangladesh was not clear. It recommended development of proper monitoring, recording and reporting network for STD including AIDS and inclusion of STD in the reporting format of the existing disease reporting profile.

The workshop expressed concern that the high incidence of STD among the people of 18-40 age group, the most active and productive age, could endanger the population causing sterility, child deformation, impotent delayed paralysis and genital cancer.

Additional Health Secretary Prof K M Farid Uddin was the chief guest at the concluding session of the workshop. Director General of Health Services Prof M A T Siddique presided.

It was also addressed, among others, by Joint Secretary of Health Dr M Khalidullah, Director of National Institute of Preventive and Social Medicine Prof Kabirullah, Workshop Coordinator Dr M A Gafur, Civil Surgeon of Cox's Bazar Dr M Fatz Ahmed Khan, and Associate Professor of Dhaka Medical College, Dr M Anwarul Hoque.

Later, Prof Farid Uddin distributed certificates among the participants.
