Mary is pre-occupied with the simple things in life and has built a fascinating collection of prints and paintings of what she has seen around her in the city. She does not confine herself to the golden ghetto, but ventures to Old Dhaka and the city life, beyond the safe confines of Gulshan or Baridhara.

Despite being a foreigner, with financial means at her command, like most artists in Dhaka, she too has had her share of difficulties in finding adequate materials to do satisfactory work. The paper she uses is sometimes too big for the diplomatic "bag", and so she has to resort to the whatever is available. Mary often uses the paper she obtains from the Mennonite community. It is made of jute, water hyacinths and various other local products. She is limited to the size of her prints as she cannot get larger metal sheets.


