#### Beijing eyes world textile market

BEIJING, Dec 23: China's textile industry needs to forge large, export-oriented syndicates and multi-national corporations to meet mounting competition on the world market, according to Ji Jun, an expert from the ministry of Textile Industry, reports Xinhua.

China has carned 13.8 billion dollar from textile exports in the past year, accounting for 25 per cent of China's total export income and seven per cent of the world textile trade.

The industry's export target by 1995 has been set at 15 to 17.5 billion dollar and between 20 and 23.5 billion by 2000.

He said his new strategy is to meet the fierce competition on world textile markets in order to increase China's share in them, because half of the world markets are under the control of western textile giants, while the fragmented Chinese companies are too small to compete with them.

Ji urged textile producers across the country to form syndicates in production and management to make good use of resources and capital.

Among them one syndicate will be responsible for direct dealing with foreign overseas clients so that the textile producers can adapt themselves to the fast changes on the world market and update their products.

On the other hand, establishing multi-national corporations was designed to combat protectionism in textiles and to promote technology transfer and personnel training as well.

# Chittagong truck strike hits garment exports

The truck workers' strike in Chittagong city is seriously affecting the garment exports. according to Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA).

The country is losing about Tk 20 crore every day for a halt to shipment of garment exports through the Chittagong Port due to the strike being observed since December 15, the association

BGMEA Monday urged the government to take measures

for withdrawal of the strike for the sake of the garment industry and other sectors.

Loading and unloading of goods including imported garment raw materials and exportable readymade garments at the Chittagong Port have been seriously hampered by the strike, the BGMEA noted.

It said December 31 and January 31 are the quota ending period for Canada and USA respectively. This means the garment units have only seven days to fill the quota for Canada and 37 days for USA, it added.

BGMEA said about 35 per cent of the total shipment of garment products are made during this peak period. If the export orders are not met within the time-limit, they may be cancelled by the respective buyers resulting in a substantial loss of garment ex-

port earnings. It viewed that the shortfall in garment sector earnings will have an adverse effect on the overall export performance of the country as half the export earnings come from this sector.
