CEC seeks cooperation to hold fair polls

Group Study Exchange (GSE) is a programme of Rotary Foundation for promotion of international understanding, goodwill and friendship through exchange of GSE teams between two countries and establishment of person to person contact.

It may be mentioned that the Bangladesh GSE team led by Past President Rotarian Hafizullah along with five other young non-Rotarians of diverse professions will visit Virginia, U S A for a period of five-week during April-May this year.

WHO to provide \$ 9.91m for health programme

Bangladesh will receive 9.91 million US Dollar from the World Health Organisation (WHO) for the biennium 1992-93 for the country's Health Development Programme, reports BSS.

An agreement to this effect was signed in Dhaka Thursday between Bangladesh and WHO following a joint meeting which reviewed the performance and examined the detailed plan of action for 1992.

Health Secretary M Mokammel Haque and resident representative of WHO in Dhaka, Dr A N A Abeyesundere, signed the agreement on behalf of their respective sides. During the last biennium (1990-91) Bangladesh received WHO Assistance worth US Dollar 8.9 million.

The WHO has been assisting Bangladesh in several health and sanitary projects which include strengthening the managerial and planning capabilities, development of human resources, besides providing equipment and logistic support.

Ideal village in char area to be set up

CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Jan 2 : State Minister for Land Kabir Hossain today said, the government would set up an ideal village in the local char area to rehabilitate about 200 distressed families, reports BSS.
