## 'Local govt to be focal point of uplift'

Information Minister Nazmul Huda said in the city yesterday that democratic local government infrastructures would be built up to ensure participation of local people in various development programmes and making different layers of local government bodies accountable to people, reports ISS.

He was presiding over the second meeting of the local government infrastructure review commission at the ministry's conference room. Huda said the commission would make necessary recommendations for building local government infrastructure as focal point of development to accelerate the pace of national uplift and achieve self-reliance.

Alamgir MP, Cabinet Secretary Siddique Rahman, Planning Commission member Dr. Sheikh Maksud Ali, Dhaka Divisional Commissioner Waliul Islam, Additional Secretary to the Prime Minister's Secretariat Dr. Kamal Siddiqui, Dr. Anisur Islam Chowdhury of Jahangirnagar University and Dr. Lutful Haq Chowdhury of Dhaka University attended the meeting.

## Police urged to work fearlessly

President Abdul Rahman Biswas Sunday called upon the police to earn confidence of the people by rendering service to them, reports ISS.

Addressing senior police officials at Bangabhaban, the President urged them to adopt new ideas to maintain peace and discipline in the society.

He said the police should be aware of the facts that they were friends of the people and not an adversary.

The senior police officials met the President on the occasion of police week.

Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury, Home Secretary M Lutfullah Majid, Secretary to President ANM Eusuf, and Inspector General of Police M Enamul Haque were present.

President Biswas said maintenance of law and order was the pre-requisite for overall national progress. He urged the police to work fearlessly and with dedication.

He said the people wanted to live in a peaceful society under a democratic system. 'You have enormous responsibility to perform in preserving this faith of the people,' he added.

President Biswas said the last government had no constitutional and moral basis to rule the country. But he added, situation had been changed and now all should develop a sense of accountability.

He appreciated the neutral role played by the police during the February 27 general elections.

President Biswas laid stress on curbing terrorism and called for extending cooperation to the government efforts in this regard. He also urged the police to strengthen their activities in checking smuggling.

The President underscored the need for preserving a congenial atmosphere in all fields of production and urged all including the opposition and parties to perform equal responsibility to ensure national development.

He praised the police for apprehending the criminals who had been hindering peace in the society. In this context, he mentioned the arrest of an infamous accused who earlier had escaped from the court.

## Appointment of CU VC undemocratic, says RUTA

RAJSHAH, Jan 5: Rajshahi University Teachers' Association (RUTA) deplored the appointment of Vice-Chancellor of Chittagong University. 'In an undemocratic way,' reports UNB.

At an emergency meeting Saturday night with Acting President Dr Md Shahjahan in the chair, the RUTA also observed that the removal of elected VC Prof Alamgir Muhammad Sirajuddin was in clear violation of the 1973 University Ordinance.

'Such a government move has encroached upon the autonomy of the university',

The RUTA meeting demanded immediate cancellation of the appointment of new VC.

It also called upon the Federation of University Teachers' Associations to sit in a meeting to take steps in this regard.

## Prof Rafiq's appointment as CU VC hailed

CHITTAGONG, Jan 5: NDP leaders here Sunday hailed the appointment of Prof Rafiqul Islam Chowdhury and Prof Badiul Alam as Vice-Chancellor and Pro-Vice-Chancellor respectively of Chittagong University, reports ISS.

National Professor Muhammad Shams-ul-Haq was the chief guest while Prof Waqil Ahmed, Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Dhaka University and Prof Mohd Harunur Rashid, Director-General, Bangla Academy were present as special guests.

Dr Abdullah Al-Muti Sharfuddin presided over the function.

Prof Abul Kashem Chowdhury of Jahangirnagar University, Dr Khandakar Sirajul Haque of Rajshahi University and Prof Montazuddin Ahmed of the Jagannath University College spoke on the occasion.

Speakers paid glowing tributes to the memory of late Dr Hilali and urged the authority to come forward and publish the unpublished works of the scholar in the national interest.

Hilali Memorial Gold Medal for '90 and '91 were awarded to Abdul Haque, Dr Anisuzzaman and Dr Muntassir Mamun for their research works and enrichment of Bengali literature and language.

## Publication of more books in Bengali suggested

Eminent educationists at a function in the city yesterday stressed the need for publication of increased number of books on basic subjects in Bengali as it would be helpful for students to gain knowledge through mother tongue, reports ISS.

They called upon educationists, scholars and publication houses to come forward in this regard to help spread of education in mother tongue.

The educationists were speaking at a publication ceremony of a book titled 'Uchatara Buddhiritik Proghya' written on philosophical outlook by Muhammad Friduddin Khan.

Principal Dewan Mohammad Azraf presided over the function at the ICMA auditorium while Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University Prof Moniruzzaman Mia attended as the chief guest.

Discussions at the function included Dr Anisuzzaman of Philosophy Department, Dr KT Hussain of Economics Department, Dr Shamsheer Ali of Physics Department and Dr ANM Raisuddin of Islamic Studies Department of Dhaka University and journalist Glas Kamal Chowdhury.

Principal Dewan Mohammad Azraf said philosophy, science and religion were

derived from the behaviour of the mankind when they became curious about everything around them, their origin and the ultimate reality.

'Although biological immortality is not possible, mankind still want to remain immortal through their good deeds and their children,' he said adding that they could finally realize through their austere practices that what would be the ultimate reality.

He said philosophy would get its full shape if it could be developed in light of life cycle. He said the Muslim philosophers had gained their philosophical knowledge through their intention and left a great deal of their wisdom for the later generations.

Referring to Molla Sadra, a great Persian philosopher who are discussed in the newly published book, Dewan Mohammad Azraf said the young learners of philosophy in Bangladesh would know the multidimensional aspects of his knowledge through this book.

Prof Moniruzzaman Mia hoped that the students would pursue their efforts in gaining knowledge in the interest of themselves and the nation. 'As we are human being, we have to spread the field of acquiring knowledge,' he said.

## JSD (Inu) to field nominees in UP polls

Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD-Inu) will field party nominees in the upcoming Union Parishad election, which is held on non-party basis as per rules concerning the local body, reports UNB.

Party leader Hasanul Haq Inu announced the decision at a press conference (Sunday) asking the authorities to recast the rules of the union council to enhance powers of its chairman and members.

He suggested formation of a special parliamentary committee to prepare a report through consultation with all quarters for providing more powers to the union council.

The JSD leader also put forward a number of proposals to make the elections free and fair. These include necessary steps by the Election Commission to ensure voting free from any influence by ministers, MPs, administration and black money.

The proposals also include maintenance of neutrality in forming project committees on Food for Works Programme,

stoppage of transfer of government primary school teachers and local officials and formation of 'Observers Team' with political party representatives.

Inu told newsmen at his party office that a seven-member 'Election Observation Committee' had been set up by JSD to oversee UP polling and help the concerned authorities ensure free and fair voting.

The observation Committee, headed by Sharif Nurul Ambia, will meet the Chief Election Commissioner and submit their proposals for ensuring neutrality in the election, he said.

In reply to a question, Inu said so far 200 candidates had expressed their willingness to contest for the post of Chairman and 1,000 for the post of Member as JSD nominees.

JSD leaders Kazi Aref Ahmed, Sharif Nurul Ambia, Shirin Akhtar and Ali Hossain Mont were among others present at the press briefing.
