### 170-team entry for Barcelona Summer Games

LAUSNNE, Switzerland, Jan 8: A record 170 teams have entered the July 25-Aug 9 Summer Olympics in Barcelona, the International Olympic Committee said Tuesday, reports AP.

All national Olympic committees recognized by the IOC accepted the Olympic body's invitations, according to a statement from IOC headquarters that did not list individual countries.

It would make Barcelona the first boycott-free Summer Games since 1972, reflecting the end of the Cold War and political reform in South


