'Private initiative a must for qualitative education'

Planning Minister Zahiruddin Khan Wednesday said the government would gradually shift its emphasis from the public to private initiative in the education sector, reports UNB.

"We want innovative ideas from the private sector for providing qualitative education in the country", he said while addressing at a certificate award ceremony on "Managerial Skill Development Workshop" at the Planning and Development Auditorium in the city.

International University of Business Agriculture and Technology (IUBAT), a private concern, organised the four-week workshop. Twenty mid-level managers from government, private and NGOs participated in the course.

Chaired by IUBAT President Prof. Alimullah Mia of the Institute of Business

Administration, Dhaka University, it was also addressed by IUBAT course coordinator Dr Abdur Rab.

In his speech, Khan said the present education environment was not conducive to development of the country and the nation badly needed private initiative for a qualitative education.

"All best schools and universities of the world are privately run and we want our entrepreneurs to come up with innovative ideas in providing technological education in the country", he said.

Referring to the proposed open university to be launched shortly, the Planning Minister said this would greatly benefit the country which was badly plagued by violence and irregularities in the education area.

Khan laid emphasis on in-

struction in English which he said being the lingua-franca, act as an effective linkage in sharing technological and developmental knowledge.

"We must learn through English if we do not want to isolate ourselves from the rest of the world", he said.

Prof Alimullah Mia said only a market oriented education programme could deliver the desired human resource development.

IUBAT, a private sector university with affiliations with universities in the USA, Canada and Europe, offers training and conducts workshops on management, computer, human resource, development and disaster management.

It will offer one year diploma course this year on computer in association with the Asian Institute of Technology.

RAJSHAHI, Jan 15: BDR personnel of 20 Rifle Battalion seized smuggled goods worth Taka 13.51 crore during the year 1991, according to an official handout Wednesday, reports BSS.

A total of 279 smugglers were held and 2010 cases were registered in this connection during the same period.

Out of the total seized goods, Taka 11.69 crore were incoming goods while Taka 1.82 crore were outgoing goods.

World Bank aid for MEP, CPE sought

Reexcavation of Chaktai Canal begins

CHITTAGONG, Jan 15: Minister for Forest, Fisheries, Livestock and Environment Abdullah-Al-Noman today inaugurated Taka 3.50 crore reexcavation works of Chaktai Canal at Bahaddarhat here, reports BSS.

Chaired by Mayor of Chittagong City Corporation Mir Mohammad Nasiruddin, the inaugural function was addressed, among others, by local leaders Dr A F M Yusuf, M Kafiluddin, Advocate Ahmed Hossain, Advocate Badrul Alam, Mohammad Abu Hafiz, Rezaul Amin Khan, Advocate Badrul Anwar, Shaha Alam and Absaruddin Chowdhury.

Speaking on the occasion the minister said present government was pledge-bound to develop the port city and as such the City Corporation had

already undertaken a large number of projects for overall development of the city.

Mayor of Chittagong in his Presidential speech urged the citizens to extend their cooperation for implementation of uplift projects Chaktai Canal is regarded as a sorrow of Chittagong city and different organisations had been demanding reexcavation of the canal for quite long time.

The 4935-metre long Chaktai Canal is being reexcavated as a part of Environment Development Programme in the city and it is financed by World Bank. The reexcavation of the canal will facilitate removal of water logging and about 15 lakh people would be benefited directly.
