ADB to review foreign exchange lending

Asian Development Bank has agreed to reexamine the current lending provisions for relending foreign exchange loans and repayment schedule of private sector projects in the country, reports UNB.

The agreement in principle was reached when the visiting Chief Investment Officer of ADB Dr Sri Bavan Skanda, met with Federation of Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) President Alhaj Md Akram Hossain at his office Monday.

Skanda has come in Dhaka to assess the investment climate both in public and private sectors of the country.

The FBCCI President apprised him of the current declining trend in investment and pointed out that high relending and exchange rates depreciation were the two major causes of current industrial sickness.

He also sought ADB assistance in channeling foreign exchange loans direct to the private entrepreneurs for encouraging industrial investment in the country.

An FBCCI press release said Dr Skanda assured of full cooperation from his agency for private sector development in Bangladesh.
