A life of extreme tolerance knew that he might never bloom at all in the long run. I did not have the heart to tell him. Child labour, in almost all the developed and many developing countries of the world is strictly prohibited by the law. But in our coun-

try there is no specific law against it. While discussing the matter with Dr Mofizul Islam Patwari, Chairman of the Department of Law, Dhaka University. I learnt that there was no definite law for the total prevention of child

labour. In Article 34 of the Constitution there is a ban on any kind of forced labour and employment by force is a punishable offence. But it also proclaims that if any one indulges in labour for the cause of livelihood or survival, it shall be permissible. There is no mention to the age of the labourer.

So the constitution is free from any blame or the burden of sharing any guilt for the exis-tence of this mammoth population of child labourers. But Dr Islam also mentioned that even if there was no total remedy for or pre-vention of child labour there is a law to control

But we can clearly visualise how much controlling is being done. Let alone the whole country, the number of child labour is increas-ing in the capital at an alarming rate. These great mass of rootless children slave through the whole day without even getting proper

wages for their labour. It is a matter of great shame and ignominy that children who are 'perhaps the only consistent result of human ecstasy as Peter Ustinov put it, are not given due attention in our country. Younger citizens of our country who are the possibilities of our future, end up






