12 students hurt as picnic bus hits hill in Rangamati

CHITTAGONG, Jan 31: At least a dozen students of Chittagong City College were injured when their picnic bus hit a hill near Manikchhari upazila in Rangamati this af ternoon, reports UNB.

Seven of the injures were admitted to Rangamati Sadar Hospital. They were identified as Sujata (26), Shilpi (20), Anju (20), Moushumi (21), Shafful Azam (21), Shamsul Alam (22) and Mahbubul Huq

The accident occurred when the driver of one of the two buses, carrying the college students back to Chittagong. lost control of the vehicle.

Doctors at the hospital said, the injured students were recovering and could be released in a couple of days.

Unhurt students returned to the port city by another bus as the driver and the helper fled after the accident. A case was filed with Rangamati police in this connection.

93 more return from Tripura

BSF kills 5 tribal refugees

Ninety-three tribal refugees returned today (Friday) from, the Indian state of Tripura raising the figure of returnees to 1,691 since January 1 this year, reports UNB.

With this, the number of tribal refugees so far returned stood at 26,897 of 8,983 fami-

The tribals who stayed at Karbuk, Lebuchhari and Kathalchhari refugees camps in Tripura crossed into the country through Puzgung and Lowung frontier and reported to the local administration today (Friday), official sources

of harassment and humiliation by the Indian Border Security Force (BSF) and the tribal insurgents across the border. Jayati (22) who served as a

medical assistant at Karbuk camp in Tripura told UNB that their team comprising of 51 tribals fell prey to the harassment of BSF while crossing the Ramgarh border on January 26. BSF opened indiscriminate fire on the group killing five of them on the spot, she alleged.

According to the returnees, at least 10-12 people are dying every day at the tribal camps in Tripura due to outbreak of dis-

eases like diarrhoea, typhoid The returnees complained and malaria as well as acute shortage of food and lack of medicare. Meanwhile, the government

has taken various income gen-

erating projects to rehabilitate

the tribal returnees in the three hill districts. Every month, 1872 metric

tons of foodgrains worth about Tk 1.68 erore are allocated for the returnees, official sources

Besides, work for the rehabilitation of 12,000 tribal families at a cost of Tk 15 crore is progressing satisfactorily, the sources added.

No nation can prosper without democracy: Biswas

President Abdur Rahman Biswas Friday said 'rule of law' and 'enjoyment of liberty and human rights' were the guiding principles of the present government to build a democratic society free from all threats, reports BSS.

"Rule of law and enjoyment of liberty and human rights are sine qua non of a good government and sincere efforts are being made to ensure independence of the judiciary and rule of law in the country.'

The President was inaugurating a seminar on "Human Rights and Liberty" organised by Asian Lawyers' Legal Inquiry Committee in collaboration with Bangladesh Legal Aid Society at the PG Hospital auditorium in Dhaka in the after-

Eminent educationist Dr Sayed Sajjad Hossain read out the keynote paper while advocate H K Abdul Hye, president

Bangladesh Legal Aid

Society, presided. Former Chief Election Commissioner Justice Sultan Hossain Khan, Barrister Tamizul Haq. Justice Abdul Wahab, Dr Sumangal Barua of Dhaka University. Dr Narayan Chandra Biswas of Dhaka University and H A Madade. Cultural Attache of Iranian Embassy in Bangladesh, among others, took part in the discussions.

President Biswas said these two principles should be upheld traditionally to build the society in an atmosphere of harmony and peace. "No nation can achieve prosperity unless the people can freely exercise their democratic rights," he said.

He said the people of Bangladesh had achieved their cherished right after a long struggle and it should be nourished through their relentless efforts for upholding the spirit of human rights and values.

President Biswas said the people of Bangladesh were the worst sufferer of human rights during 1971 when the nation had fought shoulder to shoulder to achieve contry's independence. "With the lapse of 20 years since we got independence, the nation only at present has earned their democratic rights by installing a democratic government," he

The President said the human race was still confronting innumerable sufferings due to violation of human rights in different parts of the globe. He said the inhuman torture on Palestinians and occupation of their motherland were two issues warranting immediate solution. "Human rights are yet to be established in South Africa. The spirit of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, 1948 is yet to be established in different parts of the world," he said
