

# Border resents Marsh's exclusion



PERTH, Australia, Jan 31: Rival captains Allan Border and Mohammad Azhar uddin both have

good personal reasons for wanting to win the fifth and final cricket Test between Australia and Indian starting tomorrow, reports Reuter.

Border, despite being 3-0 up in the series, has been disappointed with some of his side's performances and is now fuming over the axing of close friend and vice-captain Geoff Marsh so close to the World Cup.

The Australian skipper was not consulted over the dumping of Marsh and apparently missed the first 20 minutes of the last day's play in Adelaide as he was engaged in a animated telephone discussion with Lawrie Sawle, the chairman of selectors.

"It's hard when you lose your right-hand man who's been an integral part of our resurgence over four years." said Border.

"He's the rock of Gibralter that we've built so many of our successes around. The guy gives so much to the team. He's very close to me, so it's

Marsh's replacement Wayne Phillips admitted he was surprised to be picked but is effectively on trial for the visit of the West Indies later this year.

Marsh was found wanting in the Caribbean last year while Phillips has impressed against the West Indies, both on his Victorian debut in 1988-89 when he made a century and with 51 for the Australian XI this season in Hobart.

Australia may also give a debut to seam bowler Paul Reiffel. 12th man for the first and fourth Tests. Leg-spin bowler Shance Warne (one for 228 in two Tests) is the likely drinks water this time.
