her player destined to join the ame's elite held centre-stage for India on a history-making third day of the fifth Test against Australia at the WACA Ground here on Monday.

All-rounder Kaptl Dev. 33 last month, flashed a film-star smile around the sparse crowd as he was mobbed by teammates after becoming only the second man in history to capture 400 Test scalps.

His moment of glory came shortly after brilliant batsman Sachin Tendulkar, 18, had fashioned a breathtaking 114. considered by most observers to be the finest of his three centuries in Test cricket.

The two stunning achievements overshadowed the state of the game.

Australia went to stumps with 104-2 in their second innings, holding an overall lead of 178 with two days left. David Boon, 35 and Dean Jones, 34, were at the crease.

Unless India can make early inroads into the Australian batting on Tuesday, they seem likely to face a huge last innings target. India had earlier recovered

from a traumatic start to the day to total 272 in its first innings, 74 behind the home country's 346.

Kapti Dev reached his milestone in the first over of the final session.

The last ball of his ninth over of the innings thudded into the pads of left-hander opener Mark Taylor, and umpire Tony Creafter, after deliberating for an agonising second or two, raised his hand.

Indian players rushed in as one to shower congratulations on their elated champion, who waved enthusiastically to the crowd.

Kapil, known affectionately as "Dada" (big fellow) to millions of adoring Indian fans, was born in Chandigarh, in the Himalayan foothills.

He made his Test debut in 1978-79 season, reached 100 wickets in his 25th Test, 200 in his 50th, 300 in the 83rd and 400 in his 115th.

He has played in 58 Tests in India for 204 wickets, and has captured the remaining 196 victims in 57 Tests

The Test list is headed by retired New Zealander Sir Richard Hadlee, who captured 431 wickets.

Sipping champagne in the Indian dressing room after the day's play, Kaptl satd: "I am very happy because India is not known to produce fast bowlers. It a great moment for me and my country for an Indian to do

"When I took the 400th wicket I was thinking of my family and my friends. In my heart I said thanks to everybody."

Kapil Dev, who made his debut against Pakistan in 1978-79 at Fatsalabad, has taken 204 wickets in 58 Tests played in India and another 196 wickets in 57 Tests abroad, including the current fifth Test against Australia at Perth. While Hadlee, who made his debut in 1973, was 38 years

old when he claimed his 400th victim, Kapil Dev had just crossed his 33rd birthday when he reached his milestone. In a coincidence of sorts, while Hadlee's 400th prize came in Christchurch on Feb 4, 1990 when he trapped India's Sanjay Manjrekar lbw, Kapil achieved his landmark almost two years to the day, on Feb 3, 1992 by getting Australia's Mark Taylor dismissed in similar fashion in Perth. Well done, Kapil and carry on!

Tendulkar's innings was remarkable for its grace and maturity in a desperate situa-

He began the day on 31 and had reached 50 when India crashed to 8-159, having lost Venkatapathy Raju (1), Kaptl (4) and Manoj Prabhakar (0) for a meagre 24 runs.

Tendulkar, producing some memorable shots, proceeded to pulverise the Australian pace attack, dominating a ninth-wicket partnership of 81 with wicketkeeper Kiran More (43) in only 91 minutes.

When he was finally removed by left-arm fast bowler Mike Whitney for 114 he had been at the crease for 228 minutes and faced only 161 deliveries.

Such was his dominance that his second 50 came from only 55 balls.

advanced his series run tally to 363 at an average of 51.85. Australia lost opener Wayne Phillips before tea for 14 and

Taylor soon afterwards. Experienced campaigners David Boon and Dean Jones then settled down the Australian innings and ad vanced the score from 31 for two to 104 without further

Boon, who is fighting an injury to his right knee, was unbeaten on 35 at stumps, while Jones was 34 not out.



JOHANNESBU-RG. Feb 3 : South Africa go to their first cricket World Cup next month lacking vital international experience but armed with the advantage of surprise, reports Reuter.

The Springboks, considered by many the world's best at the time of their expulsion from world cricket in 1970. will be the unknown in Australia and New Zealand in

February and March. "We'll study videos of the teams, and the fact we don't know much about the opposition works both ways they don't know much about us.' coach Mike Procter said.

Former Indian captain Sunil Gavaskar said on a recent visit "South Africa's big advantage is they are an unknown quantity and there isn't much video footage of them. But the South Africans have videos of the other teams, and can plan

their tactics accordingly. Vincent Van Der Bijl, former pace bowler for South Africa, Natal, Transvaal and Middlesex, commented: "It's a tough initiation."

"We have two tasks, to cross the chasm from provincial to international cricket and to mould immediately as a squad." South Africa, readmitted to

international competition last year, have picked a youthful 14-man squad aiming to build for the future. But omitting their most experienced cricketer, all-rounder and former captain Clive Rice, 42, and outstanding opening batsman Jimmy Cook, 38, could cost them dear.

"Cook's absence could be a big disaster. I'm not so sure about the strength of our top order," said Colin Bryden, senior cricket writer at the
