Speakers at a workshop Wednesday called for taking up integrated planning to help formulate a strategy for welfare of the disabled, reports UNB.


"We should make sure that the strategy formulated must be implemented properly' as on many occasions we have formulated good strategies but very few implemented, they

'Peace vital to attract foreign investment'

Labour and Manpower Minister Abdul Mannan Bhuytan yesterday stressed on creating congenial atmosphere for more local and foreign investment with a view to generating increased employment opportunities, reports BSS.

In this connection the minister referred to the announcement of a new industrial policy by the government.

He said formulating a policy was not enough to attract investment and pointed out that peace and discipline in the industrial sector was the precondition for investment.

The minister also laid emphasis on increasing the labour productivity and at the same time making the wages compatible with productivity.

Bhuyian said that despite various constraints the present government is quite conscious about protecting the interests of the labour and working community.

"We believe that the labourers and workers are the main engine for attaining country's development", the minister said while inaugurat ing a one-day 'tripartite national workshop on linkages between international labour standards (ILS) and technical cooperation activities" in
