- BPCS/SRI-17/91: 1 (one) permanent post of Dairy Engineer for the Department of Livestock Service under the Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock.**
QUALIFICATION: B.Sc. Engineering (Mechanical).
OR
Diploma in Mechanical Engineering with 8 Years' experience.
- BPCS/SRI-17/91: 2 (two) permanent posts of Research Officer for the Department of Livestock Services under the Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock.**
QUALIFICATION: First Class Masters Degree in Economics/Agricultural Economics/Statistics.
OR
2nd Class Masters Degree with 2nd Class Honours in Economics/Agricultural Economics/ Statistics. Persons having experience in Development Projects will be given preference.

AGE FOR THE ABOVE POSTS: Between 18 and 30 years on 1st. Feb. 1992. Women candidate are also eligible to apply for the above mentioned posts.

- Closing date: 17th March, 1992.
- Upper age limits are also relaxable for Freedom Fighter candidates up to 32 years for the posts for which the maximum age is less than 32 years. A released/retired Non-commissioned Armed Forces personnel will get the benefit of age relaxation for Government jobs up to a maximum period the person has actually served the armed forces subject to the condition that a released/retired Non-commissioned Armed Forces personnel who has attained the age of superannuation will not be eligible for recruitment to civil posts.
- Ad-hoc appointees (if any) against the posts will be eligible to apply only if at the time of entry into services as ad-hoc appointees they were within the prescribed age limits and had the requisite qualification according to the recruitment rules.

Basunia's death anniversary observed

The seventh death anniversary of shaheed Raufin Basunia was observed Thursday with due solemnity.

Demanding immediate trial of the killers of Basunia, different students' organisations, the Dhaka University Central Students' Union (DUCSU) brought out processions and held rallies on the Dhaka University campus yesterday.

Shaheed Basunia, final year student of the Sociology Department of Dhaka University, and central Joint Secretary of non-defunct Jatya Chhatra League, was shot dead in an anti-oligarchic procession of the Jhen Chhatra Sangram Parishad in 1985.

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) held a rally in front of the DUCSU Bhaban. Khairul Kabir Khokon, Nazimuddin Alam and Ali Akkas Nadim addressed the rally.

BCL (S-A) and JSD (Int) backed BCL (N-S) held different rallies in front of Madhu's Canteen at the Dhaka University.

The Ganatantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO) also brought out procession and a rally on the campus.

Earlier in the morning the DUCSU, BCL (S-A), BCL (N-S), GCO and some other organisations laid wreaths at the Basunia monument near Mohsin Hall.

Meanwhile, the Dhaka University Sociology Department organised a discussion at the Kala Bhaban (Arts Building) with its chairman Professor Sayed Ahmed Khan in the chair.

Professor Afzar Uddin, Prof Rangalal Sen, Prof Anwarullah Chowdhury, Dr A K M Nurunnabi and student leaders, Pankaj Nath, Abul Kalam Azad Khan and Afzal Hossain took part in the discussion.

Youths urged to organise income generation activities

Minister for Social Welfare and Women's Affairs Tariqul Islam Thursday urged the youths to organise income generation activities instead of seeking official jobs as government alone could not provide all unemployed youths in public services, reports BSS.

He was speaking at the inaugural ceremony of income generation project for destitute women organised by the Palli Unnayan Parishad in the city.

Presided over by the chairman of the organisation, Major (ret'd) Wahidul Hossain, the inaugural function was also addressed by local social worker Nurul Islam Patwari, Founder Chairman of the organisation Dr Nozir Uddin and Secretary General S M Sahalet Ullah.

The minister said youths possessed potentials for innovative action and they could make avenues for income generating work.

Islam requested the local elite and affluent to give proper direction to the youths so that they could not abuse their talent.

The minister also went round different sections of the income generation project for destitute women of the organisation.

Workshop to prepare new sports policy soon

A three-day national workshop on sports will be held soon to prepare a new sports policy, State Minister for Youth and Sports Saadeq Hossain informed the Jatya Sangsad Thursday, reports BSS.

He said members of parliament, sportsmen, concerned office bearers and officials would take part in the workshop and contribute their ideas.

In reply to a question from Kazi Abdur Rashid (AL-Gopalganj), he said there were 27 sports federations in the country and three of them had elected committees. The rest are run by convening committees.

He said the constitutions of these federations were being examined for arranging elections.

He pointed out that Upazila Kirta Sangstha was the lowest

tier of the sports organisations and with the reorganisation of upazila it had become necessary to take opinion from the LGRD Division before holding elections of Upazila Kirta Sangsthas.

He said elections would be held as soon as the opinions were received.

In reply to a supplementary, he said it was not possible to say when the opinions from LGRD would be available.

He told Rashed Mosharrif (AL-Jamalpur) that the Sports Minister will act as the Chairman of the Kirta Parishad.

The State Minister also told parliament that grant assistance under government policy was now being provided to several divisional and district sports associations.

Replying to a question from Mufti Moulana Abdus Sattar

(Jamaat-Bagerhat), he said grants were being provided to four divisional, five particular districts (Dhaka, Chittagong, Rajshahi, Khulna and Mymensingh), 16 old district and 43 new district sports associations on the basis of the extent of their respective sports activities.

Replying to a question from Rahmat Ali (AL-Gazipur), the State Minister said there were 460 upazila sports associations with no specific source of income to support their activities.

He said, the National Sports Council provides each of the upazila sports associations with 17 footballs and five volleyballs every year.

There is no organisation under the title "National Sports Control Board" at present, he said.

Badruddoza urges people to change food habit

The Deputy Leader of the House in the Parliament Prof A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury, said Thursday that there was no short cut other than devotion and dedication to duty and hard work to attain overall national development and self sufficiency in all sectors, reports BSS.

We have already identified the problems and sorted out their solutions for the achievement of our goal Prof Chowdhury said and added that these solutions lay in hard work, mass education and optimum production in fields and factories.

Inaugurating a canal digging programme at Pashanchar in Strajdikhan his home area in the morning Prof Chowdhury

said that the nineteen point programme of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) embodied the prescription for the expeditious development of the country.

He said that the government had undertaken programme for universal primary education this year in order to increase the literacy rate. Prof Chowdhury also called upon the people to change food habit to relieve pressure on rice. Potato and wheat can be grown in a comparatively safe season when there is less risk of natural calamity like flood and cyclone he observed and added that these items had more food values than rice.

Speaking about restlessness among some professionals and

a section of employees in some semi-government organisations Prof Chowdhury said that the government was no more than the manager of the public exchequer and as such could not squander public money according to whims. In this connection he referred to the strike of the non-government teachers and said that everybody should look into the capability of the national exchequer before launching any demands.

Earlier Prof Chowdhury inaugurated the newly reconstructed Nimitala-Baraikhali Road. The function was addressed, among others, by Wing Commander (ret'd) Hamidullah Khan MP.
