The two other sub-cells did not estimate the amount of the money needed to rehabilitate the relevant units and referred the matter to the banks and entrepreneurs concerned, the

According to the reports of the three sub-cells, banks are fully responsible for the sickness of 11 units out of the 39 units found sick while the entrepreneurs are responsible for 10 units and both banks and entrepreneurs are jointly responsible for the sickness of 10 units.

The rest of the units became sick for some other

Out of a total 50 applicants. 21 are from jute sector. 21 from rubber sector and the rest eight are from printing sector while out of a total 39 sick industries 14 units are from jute sector. 17 from rubber sector and the rest eight from the printing sector.

Banks are fully responsible for the sickness of one unit of the jute sector, seven units of the rubber sector and three units of the printing and packages sector while the entrepreneurs are responsible for the sickness of six jute, three rubber and one printing and packages unit.

The body on sick industries has received as many as 1767 applications from the entrepreneurs who claimed their units as sick. Of them 1702 are from the private sector and the rest 28 from the nationalised sector.

The body distributed the applications to 10 sub-cells to scrutinize the applications and prepare recommendations for rehabilitation of the actual sick units, as well as to estimate the funds required for the

The initial report of the body is likely to be submitted to the government after its next meeting scheduled today (Monday).

The government has set the target of jute production this year at 55 lakh bales on 5.67 lakh hectares of land. Jute production also fell below the target last year - 45.83 lakh bales produced against a target

Summer vegetable produc tion in the country, however, crossed the target last year. Last year's total yield was 5.56 lakh tons, exceeding the target of 5 lakh tons.

MOSCOW. Fcb Commonwealth leaders have agreed to stick by the rouble as a common trading currency and are preparing to carve up the assets and liabilities of the former Soviet state bank, Itar-Tass news agency said, reports

A trade and economic agreement signed on Friday said the rouble would be used for reciprocal payments between economic entitles, for credit and for other financial operations within the

Commonwealth". The agreement, reached at a summit in the Belarussian capital Minsk and reported by the news agency on Saturday. does not mean that individual states such as Ukraine will abandon plans for separate currencies

"Where individual states of the Commonwealth introduce their own national currency. payment procedures will be determined by separate agreements," it said.

Another agreement gave the national banks of the former Soviet republics two weeks to work out ways of dividing assets and liabilities of the former Soviet state bank Gosbank, which is now under the jurisdiction of Russia.

Itar-Tass gave no details of the accords, overshadowed by heated discussion over the question of creating national armies and other military is-

This appeared to be a safe guard against the possibility of one Commonwealth member waging economic war on another.
