## 20 tons molasses will be exported to India, Europe

Bangladesh will export 20 thousand tons of molasses, a by-product of the sugar industries, to India and European countries under an agreement signed on Sunday.

A S Salahuddin Ahmed. Secretary of the Bangladesh Sugar and Food Industries Corporation (BSFIC) and Md Farid Khan, Director of the M/s Summit Industrial and Mercantile Corporation, signed the agreement on behalf of their respective organisations.

Under the agreement 10 thousand tons of molasses will be exported to India and another 10 thousand tons to the European countries.

Star Economic Report eatches in the Bay substantially, fishing sources disclose. They complain that the catches have already started to become scanty with fewer numbers of big hauls.

If Bangladesh becomes vulnerable to such oil slicks and other kinds of hazards, foreign traders will be reluctant to import fish and other commodities from the

country, they add. Sources alert that any loss of the export market would be fatal to the economy as it will take a long time to regain the confidence of the buyers.

They mention that Bangladesh earlier lost a valuable portion of the fish market in the Middle Eastern countries when 'presence' of cholera germs in our water resources were reported. They view that the government should take strict measures immediately to face the situation.

"Our products are similar to that of Indian both in terms of quality and price.. what is

needed now is immediately explore markets", said Salman Rahman a leading pharmaccutical manufacturer.

The government should immediately initiate technical assistance for manufacturers to help them know the marketing mechanism of pharmaceuticals, he said.

Earning from the sector in a year could be at least Tk 200 crore if an aggressive marketing is initiated. Rahman said.

Moreover, added the owner of Bextmco Pharmaceuticals, a comprehensive supportive policy package was of urgent need for the local manufacturers.

Manufacturers said consumers around the world, including Europe and United States, are becoming more price-conscious and increasingly taking interest in generic equivalent products which are at least 10 times cheaper than

that of their giant multinationals' produce.

Many a developing countries are making good use of these opportunities, they said. But Bangladesh was totally lagging although 99 per cent of the licensed manufacturers here are producing quality medicine with competitive price.

Salman Rahman claimed pharmaceutical sector even possesses better potentials than the garment sector.

"The pharmaceutical sector already has a good infrastructure, we know well the manufacturing technology which garments, now the leading export-earning sector, knew only a couple of years ago."

Value addition in the sector is between 50 and 75 per cent more than double the garment sector, he said. but

pharmaccuticals have never been thought as an export commodity.

He suggested that pharmaceutical sector be brought in the thrust sector in Bangladesh as in many other countries.

Withdrawal of restrictions on manufacturing several OTC (Over the Counter) items, the items which sell without prescription, such as multi-vitamins and cough syrups, would also help exports.

"Nowhere in the world are OTC items banned, but it is in Bangladesh owing to some vested interests," Rahman said.

While affecting the local industries, the ban is only encouraging large-scale smuggling of these items, depriving the country of huge revenue.

OTC items worth about Tk 100 crore are now smuggled into the country every year. manufacturers said.
