McDonald said the Committee had lowered the media tickets from U S 130, but the reporters said that the price was still unacceptable.

Those in the touring 17member squad likely to return home with Younis are off-spinner Akram Raza, left-arm seamer Saleem Jaffar and batsman Shahid Saeed.




