Title-aspirants Dhaka Mohammedan Sporting Club yesterday evening completed the registration formalities of three Russian footballers who will don their colours in the current Star First Division

The players, who arrived in the city earlier yesterday, were taken to the Bangladesh Football Federation and the DMFA's Dhaka Stadium offices last evening by elub officials and fans to sign their registration papers.

The three players are Kuznetsov. Novikov and Rastmov, all reportedly players of the famous Spartak Moscow team. Among them, Kuznetsov is reported to have played for the now defunct Soviet Union in the 1986 World Cup finals in Mexico.

The signing of these three finally puts to rest all the speculation regarding Mohammedans' overseas recruitment plans.

Mohammedans, who have already lost a game in the league, being beaten by lowly Wari Club, were worried over the poor performance of their team in this year's league so far. Their Iranian coach Nasser Hegazi, who reportedly left Dhaka without the knowledge of any club official last Thursday, appeared unhappy with the state of affairs in the club. It is reported that Hegazi, who in previous years helped bring several Iranian players for the club, was rather upset by the fact that one of his sug gested names. Syed Mohammad Sajjadi who had arrived in the city last month. was not ultimately signed by the club. Also, there has been no response from the club au thorities regarding Shahroukh Bayani, the star striker of Asian Club champions Esteghlal Club




