There were more figures in idyllic blue and white at the top to represent the need of peace and harmony in the world.

Figures of bicycles and scooters were found in graceful harmony in another painting rainbow colours were brought in. In the forefront, almost mingling with the backdrop was the seductive figure of a woman carrying a jar of water. Her face, bosom and hips were deligeated in a delectable manner. Even in a theme of pain and toil, the careful book illustrator's vision was clear.


