
## Fun run held

## Siltation, salinity threaten Sunderbans

KHULNA, Feb 28: Increa- forest. panding salinity, caused mainly from dwindling upstream flow, have threatened the Sunderbans - world's largest

mangrove forest, reports UNB. Experts said that soil character of a vast area of the 2,300- square mile forest is undergoing changes because of siltation and salinity, making many of its precious mangrove species vulnerable.

They said as upstream flow of the Ganges has declined in recent years, saline zone is expanding fast in many of the rivers and rivulets crisscrossing the Sunderbans, threatening the sundari trees, particularly on the eastern part of the

sing siltation and rapidly ex- According to forest officials, Forest experts did not rule ters submerge the respiratory more than 20 per cent of the sundari population - the most useful, multi-purpose timber in the Sunderbans - have been affected by "top dying", a unique disease in which the trees begin dying from upper

> Experts apprehend that salinity was behind the dreaded disease as its outbreak is mainly concentrated in salineprone eastern part of the forest. The disease spreads fast as the saline area expands.

> As a result, authorities are forced to extract the diseaseinfested sundari trees much before their prime, despite a total ban on felling the trees

until the year 2000. out eventual extinction of the

sundari species unless salinity is checked. Heavy siltation, caused by dwindling upstream flow, alongside the rivers and streams

and the resulting waterlogging inside the forest, said experts, was another threat to the mangrove species. Siltation is also leading to

raising of river banks and, as a result, water which used to burst the banks and flush the forest during high tide cannot come out of it during low tide. Thus water-logging inside the forest area is becoming a regular phenomena now in the

Experts said stagnated waroots of the mangrove trees, scriously disrupting their respirational activity.

Seed germination is also being scriously hampered because of water stagnation and thus natural regeneration of trees has almost come to a standstill in those areas.

"Like salinity, water logging has been a serious threat to forest resources in the Sunderbans," said Nur Mohammad Sarker, the Forest Conservator

Sarker, however, said the forest department is digging canals, with assistance from the World Bank, to drain out stagnated waters from inside the forest.

# Tk 2.5 cr plan to resolve water-logging problem

KHULNA, Feb 28: The government has undertaken a plan costing about Taka two and a half crore to resolve the water-logging problems of Beel Dakatia under Dumuria and Fultala upazilas of the district, reports BSS.

This was stated by Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation, Water Development and Flood Control M Majid-ul-llaq while briefing the local people and journalists after visiting several water-stagnant areas of Beel Dakatia Friday.

Haq said water-stagnancy problem of the entire Bhabadaha area including Keshabpur, Manirampur and Abhoynagar upazilas of Jessore district has been brought under the programme. He said the physical work of the plan

would be done with financial assistance of Asian Development Bank.

The Minister said 4,00,000 hectares of land were saved from saline water and facilities were created to yield more crops following construction of 1068 mile long embankment in and around 39 polders during the period from 1961 to 1974.

He said actually it was from 1982 when water-logging started to occur in some points of the project and as a result several thousand hectares of land of Beel Dakatia and of Jessore zone including Bhabadaha were affected.

The Minister said due to the upward trend of tidal water following decrease of water

flow in the Ganges after commissioning of Farakka Barrage as the causes of siltation and salintly in these areas. The asserted that his per-

sonal visit to the affected areas demonstrated that the present government desired the active participation of the people in the uplift activities of the country.

He highly praised the role of the local journalists to focus this problem through the mass media and thereby draw the attention of the government.

The press conference was addressed by Farhad Mazhar and Saleem Samad, the coordinators of the Group. Their views came on the eve of an official conference on the Flood Action Plan scheduled for Sunday.

Terming the FAP as antipeople, they said the plan was taken during the autocratic regime of Ershad in 1989.

The Group which claims to be a green umbrella of environmental scientists, academicians, lawyers, journalists and activists said that the offictals responsible for the implementation of the FAP kept the people in dark.

The previous government deliberately avoided public debate since the FAP was proposed by 26 donor countries and agencies, they said. The FAP is coordinated by the World Bank. It is a big-money game, they said. Quoting local experts they

said the FAP will turn wetlands into dry lands, causing ecological imbalance by destroying fish and other bio-diversity. The environmental activists

further said the environmental impacts assessment (EIA) study is yet to be completed by the US team. Without ensuring regional

water sharing with the neighbours, the implementation of 'gigantic' flood control would be a 'great mistake', the environmentalists warned.


