Agri officials asked to evolve modern technology to boost production

KHULNA, Feb 29: A two-day regional workshop organised by Agriculture Extension Department on "Development of Agriculture" along with an agricultural exhibition of Jessore region began at Daulatpur Agriculture Training Institute here today, reports BSS.

Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation, Flood Control and Water Development Majedul Haq inaugurated the workshop.

Haq called for identifying the hindrances of boosting agricultural production and

giving suggestion to solve these problems so that economic emancipation could be achieved and the condition of the farmers could be improved. He asked the officials concerned to put in their best efforts for increasing agricultural production through evolving updated and modern technology in agricultural sector with a view to making the country self-sufficient in food within a considerable time.

In this connection he said, flawless management system in agriculture should be

launched for achieving this goal. He called upon them to introduce multi-crops production projects so as to make the country self-sufficient in all crops. He also called upon them to ensure maximum utilisation of cultivable land yielding more than two crops per year.

Presided over by M Shahidul Islam, Director General, Agriculture Extension Department, the inaugural function was addressed, among others by Jatiya Sangsad Whip Md Ashraf Hossain and Agriculture Secretary K M

Rabbani. About 250 officials of agriculture department from 59 upazilas of ten districts of Jessore region are taking part in the workshop. About twenty three lakh tons of foodgrains are produced in this region whereas the demand is about 19 lakh 50 thousand tons only for which about three and a half lakh tons of foodgrains remain surplus.

Later, the Agriculture Minister inaugurated the agriculture exhibition by cutting a maize-made rake.

Japanese team gives \$8000 for school education

A Japanese team of nine members led by Yoshikuni Masaki, Executive President of Japan Telecommunications Workers' Union met the Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University Prof M Manruzzaman Miah and other members of the Bangladesh-Japan Friendship Education Committee Saturday, a press release said.

Leader of the Japanese team handed over an amount of Dollar 8000 to the Vice-Chancellor to be utilised for development of school education in Bangladesh. It may be mentioned that Tanaka, a Socialist Member of Parliament of Japan took initiative in this regard in Japan. The above amount is the first instalment and more are likely to be collected in Japan being inspired by Tanaka.

JAGPA announces Berubari long-march programme

Jatiya Ganatantrik Party (JAGPA) Saturday announced a programme of long march towards Berubari on March 2 to voice demand for its return to Bangladesh, reports BSS.

The long march is scheduled to begin from Panchagar district headquarters at 9 am on the day, according to a press release issued in the city Saturday.

The press release signed by JAGPA chief Shaiful Alam Pradhan said though Berubari, comprising an area of nine-miles, had been handed over to India, yet Tin Bigha corridor in exchange was yet to be given to Bangladesh. Berubari, he said, was handed over to India on the basis of Mujib-Indira agreement of 1974.

JAGPA brought out a truck procession chanting slogans to make the long march successful. They called upon the people for unity to foil any attempt of hegemonism.
