

Rohingyas uprooted to settle Moghs 10000 refugees enter in a day

COX'S BAZAR, Feb 29: About 10,000 Myanmar refugees crossed over Naaf river to Bangladesh side today (Saturday). This is the highest number of refugees coming on a single day, officials said, reports UNHCR.

Another camp was opened today at Dhon Palang to give shelter to the refugees streaming into Bangladesh. With this, the total number of refugee camps stood at seven in Cox's Bazar and Bandarban districts.

Inmates in the camps reported that they were living an inhuman life with inadequate food, malnutrition and sanitation problems.

Sources in the administration said company commanders of BDR and Burmese border guards 'Lunthin' had a flag meeting today (Saturday) at Ghom Dhum on the Burmese side. The outcome of the meeting was not immediately known.

Today's flag meeting was the fifth since the Burmese troops attacked a BDR outpost December 21 killing one jawan and looting arms.

BSS adds: Myanmar military junta is busy implementing an Israeli-type policy for settling Mogh population by uprooting Rohingya Muslims.

According to Rohingya refugees crossing into Bangladesh, thousands of Mogh families have occupied land and property of Rohingya Muslims in Buchidang, Mongdu, and other areas of Arakan province. The Mogh are being settled in large numbers in Muslim areas, they claimed.

Sahid Karim (45) of Mangdu, Sayed Karim (55) of Buchidong and Abdul Hashim (50) of Buchidong told BSS at Marisha Palang Refugee Camp, 'our houses and properties including bullocks and ploughs were snatched away by police and army and those were given to the Mogh settlers.' Abdul Hashim, who came to Bangladesh living behind his everything, said Rohingya Muslims will not be allowed to go back to their ancestral home in Arakan as Mogh population is given permanent settlement by uprooting Rohingyas.

Hashim had the bad luck to be forcefully evicted from his ancestral home once in 1978 and again in early 1992. 'I have left everything — land, bullocks, plough, my house,' he said. He said the Mogh are permanently settled in the areas vacated by Rohingya Muslims.

BNP behind the attack: Mizan

Acting Chairman of Jatiya Party (JP) Mizanur Rahman Chowdhury has accused that the ruling party workers attacked and foiled the JP grand rally yesterday organised in demand for Ershad's release.

'The government is totally responsible for today's incident at the meeting venue of Sayadabad,' Mizan Chowdhury told a hurriedly-called press conference at his Gulshan residence last evening.

'The BNP workers showered indiscriminate bullets on the dais under the cover of law enforcing agency members while the police lobbed tear gas shell on us,' he alleged.

He also alleged that there was a deep-rooted conspiracy against democracy and urged all the opposition parties to resist it.

'From now on this government can never claim itself as a democratic government,' the JP acting chief said adding that 'this government proved today that the voting verdict does not always constitute a democratic government.'

He said, 'We suspected a conspiracy against our rally earlier when the government refused to give permission to the holding of the meeting at our chosen venue,' Manik Mia Avenue.

The JP Acting President alleged that their workers, on their way to the meeting from different districts, were attacked in every entry point of the capital.

'Some of the BNP workers were identified as wearing police dress and carrying weapons,' he also alleged.

He claimed that the 'unruly BNP workers' damaged at least 30 vehicles carrying JP workers in different points of the capital. The ruling party workers attacked and injured JP supporters without sparing even the female workers, he said.

He also claimed that 30 of their workers were missing.

Initially at the press conference he said that three JP workers were killed by opponents' bullets and 150 others injured. But afterwards he informed the newsmen that the number of injured was 1,000.

The JP leader said that the government was not their enemy. They expected democratic manner from this government.

'But the government breached the promises given to the people during February 91 elections by today's terrorism,' he alleged.

Acting leader of JP Parliamentary Party Maudud Ahmed, Secretary General Shah Moazzem Hossain, Dhaka City Unit President Col (ret'd) M A Malik, JP leaders Anisul Islam Mahmud and Ruhul Amin Howlader were present among others at the press conference.

Shah Moazzem Hossain said, 'We suspected on Thursday that something is going to happen against our rally when some BNP leaders vowed to foil the grand rally at the presence of the Prime Minister at a meeting near Gulistan.'

The JP Secretary General claimed that at least 20 lakh people could have attended their rally if they were allowed to hold the rally peacefully.

He presented a 10-point charter of demands titled 'Dhaka Declaration' which include immediate release of JP chairman and former president Hossain Mohammad Ershad, annulment of all the black laws including Special Powers Act, fresh election to parliament, freedom of judiciary and violence-free educational institutions.

To press these demands he announced a four-month agitation programme beginning today (Sunday) with 'people's mobilisation at district and upazila levels.'

The programmes also include exchange of views with leaders of other political parties and with the representatives of foreign missions in Dhaka.

On June 30, JP would hold another rally in Dhaka and 'millions of JP workers' would march towards the Central Jail and stage court-arrest.

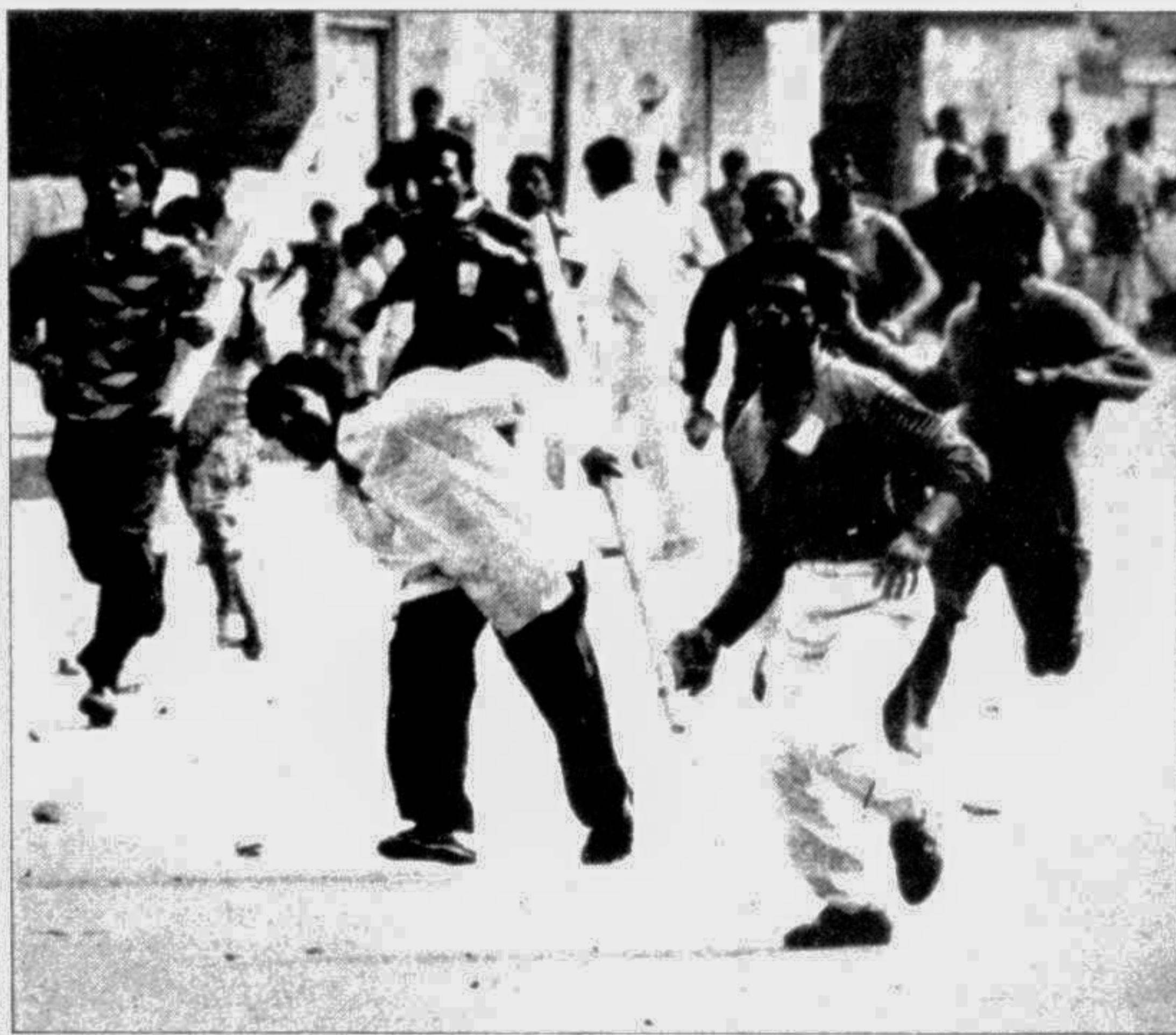
In reply to another question Mizan Chowdhury said that the BNP government, considered JP as its main rival and as they are losing popularity, they attacked and spoiled the rally.

dream of the Bengalee people to become masters of their own destiny was on the verge of being turned into a reality.

Bengalee nationalism, which articulated the hopes and aspirations of the people, and which was given shape and substance, and turned into a political movement, stood at the gate of an extraordinary triumph.

Yahya's decision to postpone the inauguration of the PNA, on the feeble excuse that Zulfiqar Ali Bhutto whose Pakistan People's Party had 88 seats, was raising objections to the idea of a hand-over of power to the Awami League, was an attempt to pre-empt the triumph of Bengalee nationalism.

The fireball ignited by Yahya's piece of treachery turned into endless processions and demonstrations on the streets of Dhaka.

On March 1, all roads led to the Purbani Hotel where Bangladesh was presiding over a meeting of the Awami League parliamentary party.

'As representatives of the people, we have a responsibility. We cannot allow this to go unchallenged,' Mujib told an impromptu press conference at the hotel, as tens of thousands of angry people converged on the Mottifheer area.

The leader called for a public meeting at the Race Course Ground on March 7, where he would announce a full programme for the coming movement.

'If the conspirators think they can suppress the people, then they are living in a fool's paradise,' Mujib told the reporters, while announcing his action programme for the next few days.

According to the Pakistan Observer of March 2, Mujib told a questioner that he would discuss the situation with leaders of other parties such

as Maulana Bhasani, Prof Muzaffar Ahmed, Aaur Rahman, Nurul Amin etc. 'as soon as possible.' He said that Bengalees should now be united to achieve their demands, and they must be ready for sacrifice.

Outside, people were pouring into the streets in their thousands all over the city. Shops, banks, business houses, offices, even government offices closed down spontaneously in protest against Yahya's announcement.

Students of Dhaka University and virtually all other educational institutions of the city marched towards Purbani to hear Mujib.

Thousands joined them en route from the Stadium where a match between a Pakistan XI and an International XI was abandoned as the crowd, angered by Yahya's decision, started pelting stones at the Pakistani players, except Raqibul Hossain who was the only Bengalee player in the team and wore a 'Joi Bangla' sticker on his hat.

In the afternoon, a huge gathering took place at the Paltan Maidan where speakers from the Awami League, Sramik League and Chhatra League called on the people to remain united and observe hartals the following two days.

Matiya Chowdhury of the National Awami Party gave a fiery speech at Gulistan.

There were processions everywhere, thousands of people carrying iron rods, sticks and bamboo staves.

The militant mood of the people was everywhere to see. Meanwhile, the night air of Dhaka on March 1, 1971, was rent with cries of 'Joi Bangla' as thousands marched into the small hours. The Pakistan flag and portraits of Muhammad Ali Jinnah were burned near the Purbani, at Gulistan and countless other places.

The march of history was entering the final stretch.
