Filming PM hampered as DFP runs out of stock

Directorate of Films and Publications (DFP) failed to cover all functions of the Prime Minister for the last two days due to shortage of raw films, reports UNB.

Sources said the problem in the DFP, the only organisation to produce national news reels, started with the audit of films used for the Prime Minister's coverage.

The audit team comprising of a director, two deputy directors, an assistant film producer, an assistant director and a senior cameraman took account of expenditure of films from July 91 to October 91.

Confidential report of their findings said 103 news shots out of total 149 were wastage, but did not state any reason. The shortage of films arose

Different kinds of pulses also surged in prices. Pulses are used in the traditional iftar food "piazi". Price of mashur leapt to Taka 32 a kg from its previous price of Taka 28. Khesari pulses rose from Taka 15 a kg to Taka 20.

Begun (brinjal) used in traditional food "beguni" also registered a Taka two rise per kg and was selling at Taka eight.

Cucumber was selling at Taka ten a kg on the eve of Ramzan. It was Taka four a kg before. Tomatoes also became more expensive and were selling at Taka 16 a kg instead of Taka 12 only two days ago. However, vendors said that the item's being off-season was the main reason for the price hike.

Potato price showed Taka one increase a kg and stood at Taka four. Beans cost Taka eight a kg while the pre-Ramzan price was Taka six. Prices of ata and flour also increased. Ata was selling at Taka 13 a kg from the previous price of Taka 12 while flour was selling at Taka 15 a kg from Taka 13.

sugar remain unsold from the previous year in the 16 sugar mills of the country as another crushing season comes to an end this month.

Bangladesh Sugar and Food Industries Corporation (BSFIC) officials said on Thursday that 7,900 tons of sugar from the last season (1990-91) are stocked in the godowns of the Corporation.

The target of the current scason 91991-92) is 2,08,000 tons, the source added. "Last year we had a bumper sugar but about 8,000 tons still remain unsold although our national annual requirement is 3,50,000 tons," an officials of BFSIC said adding "This shows how much smuggled Indian sugar has flooded the market." Last year the production

target was 1,99,000 tons which was exceeded by 47,492 tons because of bumper production of sugarcane and dull market of gur (molasses), the source added.

"Indian sugar is being sold and power crushers are being in most of the border districts
