### A Second Thought before Opening the Chest

A ting balloon on the end of a thin tube : that's all it took to end the agony of hundreds of thousands of people suffering from blocked arteries. Since the invention of this simple idea, people all over the world have benefited from angiaplasty. It avoids the mess and danger of an operation, and minimises trauma. Recently a specialist in this life saving field spoke to The Daily Star.

"Any blockage of the coronary arteries reduces the amount of oxygen to the heart. This can cause chest pain and may lead to what is usually known as a cardiac fatlure," said Dr. Tarun Kumar Praharaj during his visit to Dhaka to attend a two-day seminar organized by Bangladesh Cardiac Society on the Entire Spectrum of Heart Disease'.

Dr. Praharaj. a Senior Consultant Cardiologist of BM Birla Heart Research Centre at Calcutta, does invasive diagnosis of the heart, specializing in balloon angioplasty. He thinks that hundreds of thousands of people with heart disease can be made aware of their need for

treatment at an early stage. This treatment may include medication. coronary bypass surgery or coronary angio-

During the a half, a procedure has been employed to open partially blocked coronary vessels of the heart before they become totally blocked. This procedure is called Percutaneous Transluminal Coronary Angioplasty (PTCA). A very small catheter.

inflated to crack and compress the plaque, leaving a larger opening for blood to pass through. about one millimetre in diameter, has a balloon surrounding it, beginning a few millimeters from its tip and extending backward along its shaft for 2 to 3 centimeters. This tip of the catheter is passed under radiographic guidance into the coronary system and pushed through the blocked artery until the balloon portion of the catheter straddles partially

ing artery almost to the point of rupture. According to Dr. Tarun - it all depends upon correct diagnosis. Before an angioplastic surgery, the patients have to go through a diagnostic angiography to pinpoint the exact nature of their heart problem. Concerning the diagnosis he explained, "Special dyes, are injected into the blood stream so that the vessels feeding the heart will be clearly defined in pictures on a Fluroscope - a sort of X-ray de-

After the Balloon Angioplasty procedure. the patients are taken to a Care Unit with special monitoring equipment. Recovery in the hospital is most likely a matter of allowing the insertion site to heal before the patient can get up and walk around.

Dr. Praharaj says that developing countries such as Bangladesh and India have higher incidents of heart disease whereas the developed countries have succeeded in minimizing their cardiac cases. The main reason for this he said was that in developing countries "The basic awareness among the people is not there'.

Smoking for a long time, he indicated, is one of the common causes of coronary disease of the heart, but if someone stops smoking at the initial period, then his or her chance of having a heart attack is significantly reduced and is the same as a non-smoker. The other causes are diabetes, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, excessive tension and in most
