Tenders in sealed cover are invited from bonafide food grain traders for supply of about 50,000 MT of Wheat in cash. The offer may be either under Export Enhancement Programme (EEP) terms as provided by USDA, USA or from any other source. The particulars of the tenders are furnished below :

- a) Quantity : 50,000 MT (5% more or less at Buyer's option in case of FOB or 5% more or less at Seller's option in case of C&F). The quantity may be increased or decreased depending on situation at the time of shipment.
- b) Basis : In case of supply under EEP from USA FOB stowed and Trimmed basis. In case of supply from other sources either on FOB or C&F free out stowed and Trimmed basis. The buyer will exercise the option to accept either on FOB or on C & F.
- c) Mode of payment : Payment will be made in cash through irrevocable confirmed LC.
- d) Port of delivery : Chittagong or Mongla or both at Buyer's option.
- e) Quality, Class, Grade and Specification : Details are given in the tender document.
- f) Country of Origin : USA in case of EEP. For non EEP any source.
- g) Crop year : 1991-92 at the latest crop.
- h) Packing : In Bulk.
- i) Date of shipment : Shipment to be completed by 7th May, 1992.
- j) Port of Loading : Name of Loading port/ports to be mentioned.
- k) Time and date of closing : 11.00 hrs BST on 11th April, 1992.
- l) Time and date of opening : Tenders will be opened at 11.15 AM the same day.
- m) Validity of offer : Up to 17.00 hrs BST on 18th April '92.

2. Intending tenderers are requested to submit their offer addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Food, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh in sealed cover which must reach the Deputy Secretary (Procurement) Ministry of Food by 11.00 AM on 11 April, 1992 in the Conference Room, Ministry of Food (Room No 104, Building No 4, inside Secretariat). Tenderers or their Representatives may attend the same. The offer of tender must be accompanied by Earnest Money in the form of Bank guarantee or Bank Draft/Pay Order in favour of the Secretary, Ministry of Food, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh equivalent to 1% (one per cent) of the entire quantity offered. Further, on acceptance a Performance Guarantee bond equivalent to 5% (five per cent) of the value of the entire quantity accepted on FOB or on C&F basis as the case may be has to be furnished within 2 (Two) days from the date of acceptance.

3. Tender papers containing instructions may be obtained during office hours of working days up to 9th April, 1992 from the undersigned by paying Tk 1,500/- (Taka one thousand five hundred) by Pay Order/Bank Draft drawn in favour of the Secretary, Ministry of Food, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh by designation. Instructions contained in these documents should be carefully read and adhered to. These documents should also be submitted along with the offer being signed with official seal on each page.

4. Invitation of tenders does not in any way bind the Government to make any purchase from any intending supplier. Ministry of Food reserves the right to accept or reject any offer without assigning any reason and also to reduce or divide the quantity among different suppliers.

17 IU teachers support trial of Golam Azam

Seventeen teachers of the Islamic University expressed their support to the National Coordinating Committee for Implementation of the Spirit of Independence War and Annihilation of Killers and Collaborators of 1971, a press release said.

Grant contract with Japan signed

Yasuyoshi Ichihashi, Minister-Counsellor of the Embassy of Japan, and Edward Brand, Country Director of CARE-Bangladesh, signed a grant contract of the Japanese Small Scale Grant Assistance to CARE-Bangladesh's project for Training Immunizers in the Community Approach (TICA) on Sunday, says a press release.

The Government of Japan will extend a grant aid upto US 35,189 dollars for the project. TICA project has been assisting the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MOHFW) since July '86, in its campaign of Universal Child Immunization through rural immunization programme. The grant aid will be utilised to help train the MOHFW staff, community leaders and other field workers.

The same day Ichihashi and Venerable Suddhananda Mahathero, General Secretary of Dhammarajika Orphanage, Dhaka, signed a grant contract of the same Small Scale Grant assistance to the Orphanage's Trade School. The Government of Japan will extend a grant aid upto US 27,309 dollars to Dhammarajika Orphanage Trade School for the purchase of training equipment. The Trade School gives vocational training in the fields of carpentry, tailoring, lathing, welding, electricity and printing press.

Combined Garment Workers Front

Combined Garment Workers Front in a meeting on Monday alleged that the garment owners were repressing the workers.

The meeting presided over by Ruhul Amin said the owners never pay their wages, overtime and other monetary incentives in time.

They also said the working condition of the factories are hazardous and the factories lack adequate safety measures.

Meeting urged the owners to pay the workers Eid bonus by Ramzan 25 and not to force the workers to work overtime during Ramzan.

BIBM course

A 12-day course on 'export procedures, financing and documentation', conducted by the Bangladesh Institute of Bank Management (BIBM), concluded here Monday.

Representatives from different export-oriented industries and bankers involved in export financing participated in the course which was specially designed to assist in developing necessary services from bank.

ABM Mahbul Amin Khan, Director General, BIBM, presided over the concluding session and gave away the certificates to the participants.

CPB

Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) at a meeting Monday called upon the government to withdraw the embargo on keeping the hotels and restaurants open at day-time during Ramzan.

The meeting presided over by Saifuddin Ahmed Manik, President of CPB also criticised the government for its failure in keeping the prices of commodities stable.

Shilpakala Academy

Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy has decided to organise a fortnight-long workshop on 'mime' from March 16.

Participants for the workshop will be selected through an interview on March 15 at 10 am at the Academy auditorium.

Notice to Sangram editor for contempt of court

The Appellate Division of the Bangladesh Supreme Court Monday served a notice to the editor, printer, publisher and reporter concerned of the Daily Sangram for contempt of court, reports BSS.

The five-member court also asked the concerned persons to appear before it in person on March 18 next and show cause why they would not be convicted and punished for contempt of court.

Referring to a report, captioned 'Awami League's internal feuds are in the pick', which appeared in the Daily

Sangram on March 8, implicating the Chief Justice, the former Acting President Shahabuddin Ahmed, the court said the report of the daily was 'absolutely and totally false, baseless and mischievous, indicating that the Chief Justice of Bangladesh is involved or interested in political matters and issues.'

The court said Dr Kamal Hussain did not inform the Chief Justice of any such matter by telephone as alleged in the paper and that the Ex-President got no connection whatsoever with politics or

contact with politicians since he resumed his judicial office.

The court also observed '... such false statement/ report have undermined the public confidence in the impartiality of the Chief Justice and impaired his dignity and position as the country's Chief Justice and scandalised this court itself.'

The five-member court is composed by Chief Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed, Justice M H Rahman, Justice A T M Afzal, Justice Mustafa Kamal and Justice Latifur Rahman.

Condemned prisoner acquitted

A Division Bench of the High Court Division of Bangladesh Supreme Court comprising Justice Naimuddin Ahmed and Justice Mohd Golam Rabbani, on March 4, acquitted a condemned prisoner Rafiqul Islam of Gopainagar under Chandina, Comilla who was awarded death sentence by Sohrab Hossain, Additional Sessions Judge, Comilla U/S 302 of the Penal Code for allegedly murdering Akhter Hossain and Begun Mia of Chowk Bazar of Comilla town.

The prosecution's case in brief is that there was a quarrel between accused Rafiq Mia and Begun Mia (now deceased)

when Begun Mia assaulted Rafiq Mia causing bleeding injury and out of that grudge Rafiq Mia stabbed him with a knife at the back of Begun Mia from behind on December 28 in 1987, at about 9:30 AM while Begun Mia was proceeding towards his home.

On receiving the stab injury Begun cried out and fell on the ground. On hearing hue and cry Yunus Mia, brother of Begun Mia and others rushed to the spot and found Begun Mia profused bleeding.

Begun Mia was immediately removed to the Comilla Sadar Hospital where Begun Mia succumbed to his injury at 11 pm. Thereafter Yunus Mia

lodged FIR (Ejhar) with the Comilla Kotwali PS at 5 am the same night.

Police after investigation submitted charge sheet against Rafiq Mia U/S 302 of the Penal Code. Ultimately the case was heard by Additional Sessions Judge, Comilla who found the accused Rafiq Mia guilty U/S 302 of the Penal Code and sentenced him to death.

As against the aforesaid order of death sentence the accused preferred this appeal.

Ahmed Ali assisted by Abdul Latif conducted the case of the condemned prisoner while Gazi Abdul Mannan, Assistant Attorney General appeared for the state.

Recruitment of cadet pilots

Show cause on Biman

The Second Sub-Judge's Court of Dhaka has issued a show cause notice on Biman Bangladesh Airlines asking it to explain why the recruitment of cadet pilots should not be declared illegal, reports UNB.

The notice received by Biman Monday was issued on a petition filed on behalf of AKM Farooq, a Cabin Crew of Biman.

The petitioner complained that he had applied as a departmental candidate for the post of cadet pilot but his application was rejected on the plea of not having the required

qualifications and age.

The petition said some of the cadet pilots selected for training at BATC have not fulfilled the required qualifications as stated in the advertisement and thus violated the recruitment rules of Biman.

The petition claimed that the recruitment of Biman was deliberate and with mala fide intention.

Advocate Zulmat Ali Khan and Advocate Nuruzzaman appeared on behalf of the plaintiff.

Speaker urges NGOs to ensure better future

Speaking of the Jatiya Sangsad Shaikh Razaque Ali on Sunday called upon the non-government voluntary organisations to expand their service oriented activities to ensure a better future, reports BSS.
