**March 11 root of all movements**

Speakers at a discussion meeting here Wednesday recalled the heroic resistance by the student community in 1948 to foil the evil designs of the then authorities against Bangla language, reports UNB.  
 They said the spirit of all movements to establish Bangla as a state language was seeded in that resistance.  
 Bangla Academy arranged the meeting to commemorate the historic outburst on March 11, 1948 when the first public protest was made against the declaration of making Urdu as the lone state language of the then Pakistan.  
 The meeting, chaired by Justice Abdur Rahman Chowdhury, was participated by Professor Ataur Rahman, Abdul Matin, Prof Abul Kashem Chowdhury and Dr Mirza Mazharul Islam.  
 The opening speech was delivered by Prof Md Harun-ur Rashid, Director General of the Academy while the keynote

paper was presented by Basir-al-Helal.  
 Justice Abdur Rahman termed the day as the root of all other movements, thanked the Academy for observing the day for the first time.  
 BSS adds: In the keynote paper Basir-al-Helal said the March 11 of 1948 was marked by a violent protest march by the people against the decision of Pakistan to impose Urdu upon the vast Bengalee population.  
 He said March 11 has thus been a historic day for the nation's history of great Language Movement.  
 Prof Ataur Rahman said the Pakistani rulers had always ignored the Bangla language in spite of the fact that it was the language of the majority of the people in the then Pakistan.  
 He said growing agitation of the Bengalee population took a dramatic turn on March 11, 1948 which finally culminated into historic February 21 events in 1952.  
 Abdul Matin, who was one of the leaders of the Language Movement, said the conspiracy of imposing Urdu as the only state language by the then Pakistani rulers was the political conspiracy against the Bengalees.  
 Matin said the nationalistic spirit of the Bengalees was cemented in 1948.  
 Abul Kashem Chowdhury said the movement of March 11 was the beginning of the Bengalee nationality movement and greatly helped the people to strengthen their political rights. He said the activities of March 11 had inspired the Bengalee population of the then East Pakistan.  
 Dr Mirza Mazharul Islam said the movement of March 11, 1948 had greatly inspired the people to strengthen the activities for rights of the people for their language.

**BCIC production increases**

Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC) enterprises have produced goods worth Taka 869.61 crore during the first eight months of the current financial year as against taka 842.09 crore during the same period of the previous year, reports BSS.  
 The production of BCIC enterprises has registered an increase of Taka 27.52 crore during the last eight months from July, 1991 to February, 1992 compared with the same period of the previous financial year.  
 Giving an enterprise-wise production, a press release of the BCIC said Chittagong Urea Fertilizer Factory produced 3,94,000 tons of urea during the last eight months of the current fiscal as against 3,23,000 tons of previous year. Zia Fertilizer Factory produced 3,08,000 tons in place of 2,90,000 tons. Polash Urea Fertilizer Factory 79,000 tons in the place of 69,000 tons. TSP Complex 85,000 tons TSP in the place of 81,000 tons.  
 Like-wise, Khulna Hardboard Mill produced 11.02 lakh square metre hardboard in the place of 10.03 lakh sq. metre. Kohinoor Chemical Company 1801 tons soap in the place of 1334 tons soap. 43 tons glycerine in the place of 32 tons.
