**Workshop on SSC exam held  
'Objective type test proved  
as effective system'**

Education Minister Jamiruddin Sircar Tuesday laid emphasis on bringing about a qualitative change in the examination system for the country's over-all improvement of education system, reports BSS.

He said the traditional system of examination had already been replaced by objective type test like the European countries and it had been proved as a scientific and effective system.

The Education Minister was speaking as chief guest at the inaugural function of a workshop on objective type test and essay type question in the SSC examination of 1992, held at Dhaka Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board office in Dhaka.

Presided over by Acting Chairman of the board Golam Mostafa, the function was addressed by Director General of the board Prof Eunus Mia and Controller of Dhaka Board Eunus Ali Dewan.

The Minister said the system of education had been changed and many approaches made in the system of teaching and examination over the years. He opined that objective type test would be a milestone in education system through making the students more attentive and careful in study and reducing adoption of malpractices in the examination. Sircar said scope of widespread malpractices in the examination was a main drawback of the traditional system of examination and it might be stopped through introduction of objective type questions. He also stressed the need for sincere efforts of the conducting officials and board officials for making this system a success.

The objective type test has been introduced in the SSC examination of 1992. Under this system, objective test will carry 50 per cent marks out of 100 per cent in each subject and paper except those subjects which have practical part.
