Agri mechanisation needs specific and appropriate strategy: Experts

Experts have suggested adoption of appropriate strategy and formulation of specific short and long term policies for mechanisation in the country's agriculture sector, reports UNB.

Member-Director of Bangladesh Agricultural Research Council (BARC) Dr Maniruzzman told UNB that government has to formulate import policy of agricultural machinery and review it as and when necessary.

He suggested to formulate the production and manufacturing policy of agricultural machinery in both private and public sectors.

Immediate reintroduction

standardisation of all agricultural machinery is vital, he said and stressed on setting up of a national institute of agricultural mechanisation for research and development, testing and standardisation.

Director of Crop Wing of Agricultural Extension A K M Giasuddin Milky underlined the need for establishing a mechanisation wing (taking care of irrigation, water management and agricultural machinery) in the Department of Agricultural Extension.

This, he said, would meet the need of the farmers regarding transfer of technologies, complementing the de-

velopment work of BADC.

Action Plan should be formulated and both donors and the government should commit same kind of efforts and resources to develop facilities for irrigation and flood control.

Manual irrigation programme should be promoted for non-rice crops and, where possible, for wheat and rice as well, he said.

After full withdrawal of subsidy, a deep tubewell will cost Tk six lakh, which farmers cannot afford and there should be an alternative technology to replace deep tubewell before withdrawing subsidy. Otherwise this might have serious negative impact on the irrigation development,

Beijing presses ahead with price reform

BEIJING, Mar 18: Chinese will pay a lot more for rice and bread from April 1, as Beijing presses ahead with price reform to relieve the burden of subsidies on the state, officials said, reports Reuter.

The state is passing the burden of subsidies from its budget down to the workplace. But workers will get a pay rise to help deal with the new prices. Chinese who had been

briefed on the measure said. The price of rice bought in state stores with ration coupons will jump about 44 per cent and flour will climb 41 per cent, they said.

And official at the state ad ministration of commodity prices confirmed there would be a nationwide rice rise, but declined to give details.

While the increase is big in percentage terms, especially when combined with a rise of more than 50 per cent in the price of grain last year, the

heavily subsidised prices will still be low by world and even Chinese standards.

Prices are always going up," said one old woman." This I'd call an adjustment, not really a rise."

According to the Chinese who were briefed on the rises, rice will be 38 Chinese cents (seven US cents) for 500 Standard quality flour will

cost about the same. To cushion the blow of higher prices, every worker will get a new monthly subsidy of five yuan.

The average urban worker makes between 150 and 200 yuan per month, but gets heavily subsidised housing, medical care and other benefits.

Chinese leaders are trying to shift the burden of subsidies away from the state, to make companies more responsive to market forces and to ease pressure on a budget that has suffered ever-increasing
