Matin stresses development of export oriented goods

Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury Thursday stressed on the use of country made goods for activating the pace of domestic business, reports UNB.

At a reception meeting of the newly elected office bearers of Bangladesh Shop Owners Federation and Dhaka City Shop Owners Samity Federation here Thursday evening, he said the government will cooperate with the business community to establish industries aimed at reducing dependency on foreign goods.

He observed that unabated smuggling crippled the economy of the country and stressed on development of export oriented goods like 'muslin' and 'Jamdani' for overseas market.

Referring to the growing menace of toll collection by some unscrupulous elements he said the government was firm to deal with them severely.

He demanded the shop owners to inform the authorities about the toll collectors so that they could be tracked and punished accordingly.

Amir Hossain Khan, Helaluddin and Mohammad Mohsin from the shop owners association also spoke on the occasion.

"Move to constitute 'peoples' court' violation of law"

GCO declares mourning day today

'Killing can't stop movement'

Ganotantrik Chhatra Otkya (GCO) will observe mourning day today (Friday) across the country to protest the killing of Yasser Arafat Pitu, a student of Rajshahi University.

Pitu, also a leader of GCO, was shot dead on RU campus Tuesday afternoon.

The GCO activists and supporters observed countrywide demonstration day Wednesday protesting the killing.

The GCO leaders Thursday at a demonstration rally in front of the National Press Club

accused the police and Chhatra Shibir activists of the killing. They said a joint assault by the police and Shibir activists killed Pitu.

The rally was addressed by Nasir-ud-Doza, Belal Chowdhury, Noor Ahmed Bakul, Abus Sattar Khan, Ahad Ahmed and Abu Aslam Mintu.

The leaders threatened the government saying that the ongoing movement of the people on the public trial of Golam Azam on March 26 could not be stopped by repressing or

killing the student leaders.

They also condemned the government for its alleged support to the anti-liberation forces.

Addressing the rally the GCO leaders also said that the government would have to face the same consequences like Jamaat-Shibir if failed to meet the demand of the people on Golam Azam issue.

Earlier the GCO brought out a procession from the Madhu's canteen to Dhaka University at about 10 am.

Projonmo '71 supports Azam's trial

Projonmo '71, organisation of the children of the martyrs of 1971, gave unequivocal support to the planned public trial of Pakistani citizen Golam Azam who was reappointed the Amcer of Jamaat-e-Islami after a 20-year break.

At a public gathering organised outside the National Press Club Thursday, speakers belonging to Projonmo and the Committee for Resistance to the Killers and Collaborators of 1971 (CRKC '71), reiterated their determination to put Azam on public trial on Independence Day on March 26 at the Suhrawardy Udyan.

Speaking as the chief guest, Jahanara Imam, convener of the CRKC '71, told the rally to remain alert against provocations and not to slacken the movement in the face of threats.

Shahrier Kabir, Executive Editor of the Weekly Biehitra and a leading figure in the People's Court movement, reminded the gathering that Nazi War Criminal Klaus Barbie was brought to France from Latin America and put on trial 45 years after his crimes against humanity.

"If Barbie can be tried after 45 years, then Golam Azam can surely be tried after 21 years. There is no constitutional problem", Kabir said.

A number of speakers at the gathering termed the recent events in Rajshahi University, where at least 15 students had veins in their arms and legs severed by activists of Jamaat's student front, the Islami Chhatra Shibir last Tuesday, as an attempt by Jamaat to foil the movement against its Amcer.

Presided over by Saidur Rahman, President of Projonmo '71, the meeting was also addressed by Tauheed Rezanur, Babul Chandra Day, Salma Haq, Maghna Guha Thakurta, Sadeq Ahmed Khan, and Kazi Saifuddin Wali.

Faruk demands cancellation of 25-year treaty with India

Freedom Party Chairman Colonel (ret'd) Syed Faruk Rahman on Thursday demanded immediate cancellation of 25-year treaty with India terming it as a 'slavery deed' for Bangladesh.

"If this government and the parliament truly represent the people they will take initiative to cancel it otherwise the people will remain the slaves of India for another five years," Syed Faruk said at a press conference marking the date of signing of the accord in 1972.

Party co-Chairman Abdur Rashid and chief Staff Co-Ordinator Chowdhury Mohammad Faruk were present at the conference at the party's Dhanmondi central office.

Col (Ret'd) Faruk said that India had been using the agreement as a shield and acting at her whims in resolving the outstanding issues.

The agreement has already been annulled as India violated many of its clauses," he said adding that "it now needs an official announcement."

The water sharing issue, Tinbigha enclave, Talpatti, Shantibahini and Bangabhumii issue all remained unresolved because of Indian obstinacy. Of late India started conspiring with Golam Azam issue to divide our society.

He suggested signing multi-lateral treaty with Pakistan and China to face India.

He termed the move by certain quarters to hold a "public trial" of Golam Azam as a well-planned conspiracy designed by India to divide the nation.

On Rohingya issue he said that "retaliation is the only

way-out in resolving the dispute with Myanmar". "Our army is stronger than that of Myanmar and the geographical position of Arakan will favour our army but our government is following an appeasing foreign policy with a country like Myanmar," he said.

"Military is tool of politics, so there is no harm in using army to solve Rohingya problem," he added.
