Attack on newspaper offices condemned

A joint meeting of Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) Saturday condemned armed attack on the offices of daily Inqilab, daily Sangbad, daily Al-Ameen, daily Sangram, daily Meilat, daily Bhor and Chittagong Press Club during last few days, reports BSS.

The speakers at the meeting, presided over by BFUJ President Rezauddin Ahmed, observed that the hard-earned democracy and freedom of the press cannot remain hostage at the hands of some indiscreet quarters.

The speakers cautioned that the journalists would resist the identified terrorists if good sense did not prevail upon them.

The meeting urged all political parties, professional groups and student organisations to come forward to stop attack on the newspaper offices.

The meeting sought tolerance and cooperation of all to facilitate the publication of all views and opinions in newspapers.

DUCSU
Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) Saturday condemned the attack on different newspaper offices.

Amanullah Aman, MP and Khairul Kabir Khokan, Vice-President and General Secretary respectively of DUCSU in a joint statement described such attacks as a part of the design to disrupt the democratic process. They demanded arrest of the attackers and their exemplary punishment.

Salam Talukder
LGRD and Cooperatives Minister A Salam Talukder Saturday strongly protested the attack on different newspaper offices including Inqilab, Meilat, Sangbad, Dainik Bhor and Al-Ameen.

He described such attacks on newspaper offices as an attack on democracy as freedom of press was a precondition to democracy.

Talukder, who is also Secretary General of BNP, said the attackers on newspaper offices were enemies of democracy.

The people would not tolerate such attack in future, he asserted. He urged all concerned to refrain from such heinous activities in future.

Begum Khaleda Zia stressed the need for balanced trade between Bangladesh and Malaysia.

HERE and THERE

Nirmool Committee

The Dhaka Metropolitan branch of the Ekatturer Ghatok Dalal Nirmool Committee held a meeting with all its city units Saturday.

Chaired by Sadek Ahmed Khan, the meeting was addressed by Col (Retd) Nuruzzaman as the chief guest. Other speakers were Mia Abul Hashem, Abul Bashir and Mamunur Rashid.

Col (Retd) Nuruzzaman in his speech said that it was the moral duty of the democratically-elected government to execute the verdict of the 'Ganaadalat' that pronounced Thursday that Golam Azam was punishable by death sentence for war crimes.

Later, a procession was brought out from the Committee office.

Society for professionals

Samajtantrik Chhatra Front at a meeting of its central committee Saturday demanded of the government that the verdict of the 'Ganaadalat' be executed.

Chaired by the organisation's President Belal Chowdhury, the meeting called on the people of all strata to compel the government to implement the verdict.

Faridpur Service Holder Assoc

Service holders and other people of different professions and trades belonging to greater Faridpur district now living in Dhaka have decided to submit a memorandum to the relevant quarters requesting them not to include any part of greater Faridpur district with the proposed Barisal division.

A special meeting, held Saturday at the National Museum Auditorium also decided to make a representative to the government for setting up a new Divisional headquarters at Faridpur with the present five districts of greater Faridpur and parts of other adjoining districts having geographical contiguity, good communication network and other advantages.

UCL

United Communist League of Bangladesh in its central committee meeting on Saturday urged the government to implement the people's verdict about Golam Azam immediately.

A resolution of the meeting presided over by Shafiquddin Ahmed condemned the government stance on Golam Azam and pointed out that the government failed to serve show cause notice to Golam Azam even after his becoming the Ameer of Jamaat.

The resolution regretted that the government, instead, took legal actions against the public trial.

The meeting also viewed that the arrest of Golam Azam was initiated by the people's protest, not by the government's willingness.

The meeting was also attended by General Secretary of the party, Bimal Biswas, Amal Sen and Tipu Biswas.
