Purbadhalla and Zaria everyday. The waiting rooms of various stations are almost unfit for use. Women passengers are the worst sufferers. The toilets in the waiting rooms are emitting bad odour constantly in the absence of clealiness.

In some of the stations of these lines, there are no sheds on the railway platforms causing untold sufferings to the passengers. The situations worsens during the rainy sea-


