Jansher's chance to break the jinx



Jansher Khan, the most consistently successful squash player on the circuit in the

last four years, is out to beat the jinx that has afflicted him in the world's best known tournament, reports AFP.

The 22-year-old Pakistani has already won the World Open three times, helped his country to the world team title in 1987, and captured dozens of titles all around the world.

But he has never won the oldest and most prestigious event, the British Open, which starts here on Wednesday, even though he has twice started as top seed. Jansher will now be top
