Educational qualification : Post Graduate degree in Economics/Statistics from a recognised university.

Educational qualification : Graduation degree in Science with Zoology/Chemistry. Female candidates are also eligible to apply for the above (at Nos 4 & 5) posts.
- BPCS/C/A-5/92** : Technician-cum-Sound Recordist of Public Relations Directorate under Ministry of Information — 1 (one) permanent post.
Educational qualification : (a) 3 (three) years Diploma passed from Bangladesh Technical Education Board.

Educational qualification : Graduation degree from a recognised university with 3 (three) years experience or retired Defence/Police personnel of JCO/Police Inspector.
Age : Maximum 30 (thirty) years on 1st March, 1992. Age relaxable in case of former Defence/Police personnel.
- BPCS/C/A-4/92** : Cameraman of the Department of Films & Publication under Ministry of Information — 1 (one) permanent post.
Educational qualification : (a) Graduation degree from a recognised university.
(b) Minimum 5 (five) years independently working experience as Cameraman on whole time basis at a government organisation or a reputed film studio or film producing firm.
(c) All round comprehensive knowledge about 16 mm and 35 mm black & white and colour movie science.
(d) Indoor and outdoor filming capability on self enterprise.
(e) Knowledge of indoor lighting arrangement for shot taking and experience of newsreel and documentary film taking.
(f) Knowledge of after-shot cutting & finalisation and opticals and title preparation preferable.
Age : Should be between 25 and 30 years on 1st March, 1992. Relaxable up to 40 year for government employees. Female candidates are not eligible to apply for above (at Nos 6, 7 & 8) posts.

General Important Informations

- Last date of receiving application : 20th May, 1992.
- In case of posts where maximum age limit is below 32 years, the maximum age limit for freedom fighters is relaxable up to 32 years. In case of government service released/retired non-commissioned Army personnel will get the favour of age relaxation up to the maximum tenure of his original service in the Army.
- Adhoc appointee (if any) being within prescribed age limit as per appointment rules at the time of adhoc appointment and having required qualification can apply for the same post.
- Persons appointed to the advertised posts on adhoc basis and government employees as well as employees under local authorities should submit their original application with Treasury Challan and necessary certificates direct to the prescribed office of the Commission subject to reach on or before the last date of receiving application as mentioned in the advertisement. Simultaneously another copy should be sent to the Commission through the appointing authority.
- Domicile : Should be Bangladesh national and permanent resident or domiciled (according to instructions in the application form) here.
- Candidates will be selected according to present government instruction regarding quota reservation including quotas for meritorious, freedom fighter and female candidates etc.
- Fees : Bank Draft/Pay Order for Taka 25.00 from Sonali Bank in favour of Secretary, Bangladesh Public Service Commission Secretariat or Treasury Challan of Depositing Taka 25.00 under head "65 miscellaneous non-tax revenue" as "miscellaneous examination fee" (according to instruction in the application form) must be submitted with each application.

- Candidates must submit attested copy of undermentioned certificates with their applications otherwise their application will not be considered:
(a) To prove age : Original certificate of S S C/Matric or equivalent examination. Provisional certificate or admit card or testimonial will not be acceptable in this regard.
(b) To prove educational qualification : Original certificate from Board or University. Being unable to furnish original certificate of Board or University, provisional certificate from Board or University will be accepted.
(c) In case of freedom fighters : Certificate signed by the Chairman of Bangladesh Muktiyoddha Sangsad and by the Chief Adviser of the Sangsad the Hon'ble President.
(d) In case of Tribals : Original certificate from the appropriate authority.
- No application will be considered unless age, educational qualification, experience etc. are supported by documents/proofs including attested copies of Board/University/Institute certificates.
- Any recommendation is liable to disqualify the candidate.
- The Commission will consider all applications received and take interview of the appropriate candidates. If necessary, the Commission will also take selection test before interview.
- If the Commission does not decide otherwise, the interview will be held at the candidates respective Divisional headquarters; but if the candidates of other Divisions so desire in their application, their interview may be taken in Dhaka.

World Health Day observed

'Health system being restructured'

Minister for Health and Family Welfare Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yousuf Thursday called for concerted efforts of all-concerned to reinforce preventive measures against heart ailments in order to bring down mortality rate by this killer disease in the country, reports BSS.

"We can bring down the rate of deaths by heart diseases by 80 per cent through reinforcing preventive measures against this menace," he said and laid stress on expansion of institutional infrastructure and increase of efficiency in the application of high technology to cure heart diseases.

The Health Minister was addressing as the chief guest the inaugural function of the celebration of World Health Day at the Osmani Memorial Hall here.

The World Health Day was observed throughout the world on April 7 under the theme "Heartbeat — the rhythm of health" chosen by the World Health Organisation (WHO) for 1992. In Bangladesh, the Day was observed two days later because of the Eid-ul-Fitr vacation.

With Director General of Health Services Dr M A T Siddique in the chair, the inaugural function was also addressed by Deputy Minister for Health and Family Welfare Mohammad Serajul Huq, Secretary of the Ministry Syed Ahmad, WHO Representative in Bangladesh Dr A N A Abeyesundere, Director of the Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases Dr Abu Jafar and Director of the Bureau of Health Education Nazrul Islam.

The function was attended, among others, by diplomats, heads of UN missions in Dhaka, NGO representatives, high government officials and senior officials of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and divisions and departments

under it.

Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yousuf called upon all concerned to integrate the "prevention and control programme on heart diseases" with the implementation process of prevailing health services activities at all spheres.

He also called for voluntary participation of all including the mass media in the struggle to make lives free from diseases which is one of the fundamental rights of the people.

The Health Minister appealed to the donors and the WHO to come forward with more help for improvement of the overall health system in Bangladesh.

"I hope WHO will make its effective contribution in preventing heart diseases in Bangladesh because our resources are limited and the number of doctors and infra-structural facilities are not sufficient to combat this killer disease," he said.

He also appreciated the measures taken by the WHO in this regard.

Yousuf said the standard of national health was still in a poor condition due to various health problems including malnutrition.

"Thousands of people die of diseases like diarrhoea, tuberculosis, typhoid, diabetes, cancer and heart ailments and the poor economic situation is being weakened more and more due to such unexpected deaths," he said.

The Health Minister said the government was committed to preserve and improve the national health and the health system was being restructured to meet the demands of the people in the health sector.

He said the aim of the government was to improve the health standard through implementing the primary health care by utilising available re-

sources. "Priority is also being given an individual, family and collective participation of people in preventing and controlling diseases in the country," he said.

The Minister said directives were given to all concerned with health services to reach proper information and education about health care to the people.

Deputy Minister for Health Mohammad Serajul Huq called for launching a vigorous awareness drive against heart diseases and spreading of health education and information among the general masses for their health care.

WHO Representative Dr ANA Abeyesundere said the rheumatic heart disease was largely prevailing in the developing countries including Bangladesh.

According to the WHO's estimates, cardiovascular diseases take 12 million lives annually and half of the deaths are from the developing countries.

Later, the Health Minister gave away awards to the winners of different levels of the essay competition on health education and children art competition jointly conducted by the Bureau of Health Education and the Shishu Academy.

The Minister also handed over the WHO's gold medal to the Director of the Bureau of Health Education Nazrul Islam as a mark of honour to the Bureau's anti-smoking campaign in 1991.

He also opened an exhibition on health education at the auditorium.

The Day was observed at national, district, upazila and union levels through holding seminars, discussion, health education exhibition, film show and other means.

Cooperate for balanced development : Mostafiz

Foreign Minister ASM Mostafizur Rahman Thursday called for extending all out co-operation to the present democratic government for the fulfillment of hopes and aspirations of the people as well as balanced development of all the regions, reports BSS.

He said the government was pledge bound to implement the unexecuted programmes of shahed president Ziaur Rahman as only these programmes could ensure the socio-economic development of the people.

The Foreign Minister was addressing the inaugural function of the newly constructed Bagerhat Zila Parishad Office Bhaban.

The function was addressed, among others, by Syeda Nargis Ali MP, district Bar President Shamsul Haque, and local BNP leader A T Monwar Uddin.

The two-storeyed building

Both the parties demanded government assurance to provide immediate supply of diesel to end the crisis.

Sohel was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital where doctors declared him dead, they said.

Police arrested Karim while a charge of murder was brought against him.
