There are hundreds of non-government organisations (NGOs) in our country. But I have not come across any whose mandate is 'development communication'. comments Khairul Bashar. He is serving as the executive director of Asian Institute for Development Communication (AIDCOM), based in the Malaysian capital, Kuala Lumpur.

As the head of AIDCOM puts it, the planning for AIDCOM started in 1985, at a time when Bashar was posted in Paris with UNESCO.

lack of co-ordination. Development communicators, as Bashar says, often wish to teach receivers, or to make use of the receivers' existing habitual responses and to send messages which take them into


