Miandad criticises Imran's plans



KARACHI, Apr 9: Pakistan's prolific run-getter and vice-captain

Javed Miandad attacked skipper imran Khan's call for changing the domestic cricket structure here Thursday, reports AFP.

Speaking to reporters. Mtandad, 35, who made his Test debut in 1975, said "Imran's call to change the format of domestic cricket is based on a lack of knowledge of domestic cricket as he hasn't played it since the early

Imran, 39, said after returning from World Cup victory in Australia last month that the structure of cricket in Pakistan was 'dead and had no contribution at all in the team's victory in the World

But his call for the game to be reorganised on a regional basis has been attacked by former Test players and offi-

Miandad's criticism of imran's proposal, however. takes the controversy a step further and may have an impact on the selection of Pakistan's squad for their forthcoming tour of England, cricket sources said.

The Pakistani game could only be changed on Imran's say, he said, adding that those who supported imran were all outside cricket. The people in the game are all opposing him," he said.



AIDS virus, reports AFP "Some of you heard that I had tested positive for HIV. the virus that causes AIDS. That is indeed the case," Ashe

told a press conference where he was flanked by New York Mayor David Dinkins, his wife and doctors. The virus was transmitted through a blood transfusion

during one of two heart operations he underwent in 1979 and 1983. Ashe said He found out when he went

into hospital again for a brain

Ashe said. Dinkins said he was 'deeply sad" to learn that Ashe had

Close friend Virginia Governor Douglas Wilder said earlier Wednesday that Ashe, the first Black man to win one of tennis' Grand Slam tournaments, accepts the diagnosis as "something he has to live with."

It is the second time in six months that a prominent US athlete has announced that he has the AIDS virus.

WASHINGTON, Apr President Bush telephoned Arthur Ashe on Wednesday and wished him well in his battle against AIDS, reports AP.

Ashe announced at a news conference Wednesday that he had been infected with the deadly virus during a 1983 heart operation.

Ashe said he contacted Health and Human Services Secretary Louis Sullivan on Wednesday before his news conference to get word to the President. Sullivan reached Barbara Bush, and the President called Ashe shortly after noon.

They spoke for a few minutes and Bush 'wished his well, said White House spokeswoman Judy Smith.

'At some stage I will get involved in the President's Commission on AIDS," Ashe said, without elaborating

There are no seats currently open on the 15-member commission, whose members include AIDS-infected basketball star Nagtr Johnson. But White House spokeswoman Smith said, referring to Ashe, that Bush believes 'there are several ways he can help educate the American public," about AIDS.

Johnson recently threatened to quit the commission unless the Administration commits more money for AIDS projects.

This year's spending on AIDS research, treatment and prevention is dirs 4.3 billion.
