Jamaat condemns attack on Arakan Eid congregation

Jamaat-e-Islami brought out a procession in the city Friday after Jumma prayers condemning the attack by the Myanmar troops on a Eid congregation in Arakan province, reports UNB.

The attack had resulted in death of 34 Rohingya Muslims. The processionists shouted slogans denouncing persecution and atrocities unleashed by the Myanmar troops which forced the Rohingya Muslims to flee their homeland.

Earlier, the city Jamaat which sponsored the procession held a rally at the northern gate of Baitul Mukarram Mosque. Speaking at the rally, assistant secretary general of the party Muhammad Quamruzzaman criticised the government for pursuing a "subservient policy" in tackling the problem.

"The problem would have been solved earlier had there been a pragmatic and courageous policy", he observed.

The Jamaat leader also castigated the government for remaining silent on the incident of firing on the Eid jamaat claiming lives of Muslim devotees.

Quamruzzaman urged the international community to create pressure on the Myanmar military junta to take back the refugees.

Presided over by city Ameer A T M Azharul Islam, the rally was also addressed by Saiful Alam Khan Milon and Jastmuddin Sarkar.

Expert body to study feasibility of SADF

SAARC Secretary-General Ibrahim Hussain Zaki has set up a panel of experts to examine the proposal of the King of Bhutan to undertake a pre-feasibility study for the establishment of a South Asian Development Fund (SADF), according to a message received in Dhaka Friday, reports BSS.

The seven-member panel constituted by the SAARC Secretary-General with member governments will include M Munir-uz-Zaman (Bangladesh), K K Bhargava (India), Hon Ismail Pathy (Maldives), Himalaya Shumsher JB Rana (Nepal), Ejaz A Naik (Pakistan) and Dr W Rasaputram (Sri Lanka).

Lyonpo Dawa Tsering, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Bhutan, will chair the first meeting of the panel of experts which is scheduled to be held in Thimphu on April 21 and 22.

The panel is expected to undertake an in-depth examination of all aspects of the proposal of the King of Bhutan and submit its recommendations to the SAARC heads of state or government. The panel has been set up in pursuance of the decision of the sixth SAARC Summit held in Colombo last month.

92 poor students awarded prizes

World Vision of Bangladesh, an international relief and development agency awarded prizes to 92 poor students for their achievement in the 1991 SSC, HSC, and BA examinations, says a press release.

The State Minister for Education Principal Mohammad Yunus Khan distributed prizes among the students Thursday as the chief guest at a ceremony at Notre Dame College auditorium. The ceremony was presided over by James Hilton, World Vision's Executive Director.

The State Minister said that World Vision was playing a vital role in implementing the slogan "Literacy for all by the year 2000".

Mohammed Shahidul Alam, Director General of NGO Affairs Bureau also spoke on the occasion.

Govt adopts new promotion policy

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on the Establishment Ministry, in its second meeting Friday discussed the promotion policy of the Establishment Ministry especially the recent promotion in the Deputy Secretary, Joint Secretary, Additional Secretary and Secretary levels, reports BSS.

Presided over by the State Minister for Establishment Md Nurul Huda, the meeting was participated by the Education Minister Jamiruddin Sirkar, Mohiuddin Ahmed MP, Dr T I M Fazle Rabbi Chowdhury MP, Syeda Begum Sajeda Chowdhury MP and Md Shamsudohha MP. Hasinur Rahman, Establishment Secretary was present.

The State Minister for Establishment explained in details about the procedure in giving promotion to the civil servants. He pointed out about the defects in making the Annual Confidential Reports (ACR), keeping this in view a new system has been adopted in giving promotion, he added.

Huda said, 60 marks from ACR and 40 marks for viva-voce had been set before starting the procedure which was approved by the cabinet out of 100 marks, pass mark has been fixed at 75, he added.

The State Minister said, from 1973, a huge number of civil servants had been appointed in each batch and this was in contrary to the number of incumbent in civil service during Pakistan and even British period. He said promotion should follow the pyramidal form, that is, the number of the promoted officers must be below the number of officers in the base level and each stair there was a base level. So, superstition in promotion is always admissible, he said adding that since 1985, the promotions in the higher had almost been stopped. As a result, huge number of officials have been eligible to face the council committee or promotion committee, he said. So superstition had been happened in a large scale in the last promotion process, he added.

Huda said any specific and general complaint about the promotion procedure would be scrutinised thoroughly. He said, "this government is accountable to any of its activity and we believe that every wrong has the remedy". Through mutual understanding and cooperation, we are trying to establish an efficient and people-oriented administration, he added.

Nirmul Committee's target govt, not Azam: Freedom Party

Freedom Party Chairman Col (Retd) Syed Farook Rahman Thursday said that the target of the so-called 'Trial Committee' was not Jamaat chief Golem Azam but the government of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia.

Addressing a press conference at party's central office he said that Awami League chief Sheikh Hasina's letter on the date of 'public trial' indicated a deep-rooted conspiracy against the government. "Many ruling party MPs have signed a conspiracy deed of the Trial Committee and they (MPs) can walk out during the forthcoming session," Rahman said.

He also said that the government had been trapped by arresting Golem Azam.

Referring to the Lockerbie issue he said the UN Security Council had become a wing of the United States which is conspiring against the Muslim world.

Rashid made member of WHO's expert panel on malaria

Dr. K. M. Rashid, formerly Senior Regional Adviser, World Health Organisation, South-East Asia Regional Office, New Delhi has been appointed a member of the Expert Advisory Panel on Malaria for a period of four years, says a press release Friday.

Prior to joining the World Health Organisation Dr. Rashid was the Director of the Malaria Eradication Programme, Bangladesh.

Dr. Rashid was the first to join an UN Organization after the Liberation of Bangladesh.

'Canal digging inspires to be self reliant'

The re-excavation work of Goaldundo-Ujanchar canal under Rajbari is progressing fast, reports BSS.

State Minister for Cultural Affairs Prof Jahanara Begum who visited the area Thursday saw the re-excavation work.

Speaking before a spontaneous gathering, the State Minister said the late president Ziaur Rahman had initiated the canal digging programme to attain self-sufficiency in food and added that if we can achieve food autarky, it would inspire the whole nation to be self reliant in every sector.

She urged people in all walks of life to participate in canal digging under the leadership of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia to make the programme as success.

The State Minister told that with irrigation facilities created on completion of the re-excavation of the 12-kilometre long and 7 metre wide canal, it is hoped that an additional amount of three lakh metric tons of food-grains would be produced.

Make 'March towards JS' a success: CPB

The Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) has supported tomorrow's Sunday's march towards the Jatiya Sangsad and urged all concerned to make the programme a success.

The support was expressed at a meeting of the CPB president held at the party's central office Friday with Shamsud-doha, MP, in the chair.

The march-towards-parliament programme has been planned by the National Coordination Committee for Realisation of the Spirit of the Liberation War and Resistance to the Killers and Collaborators of 1971 to press for execution of People's Court judgement that the controversial Jamaat leader Golem Azam be sentenced to death for war crimes.

The CPB meeting at a reso-

The meeting has observed with great concern that the anti-liberation and reactionary forces in the country were attempting to create chaos through deliberations against the people's verdict on Golem Azam. It also urged all the pro-liberation forces to be united on the question of realising the verdict.
