# Saifur pleads for Tk 1800 cr fresh taxes

The exchequer needs at least Tk 1,800 crore in fresh taxes in the coming budget in addition to the current fiscal's revenue projection, said Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman yesterday, reports

The additional revenue has to be collected to meet inevitable spending by the government, he said while addressing the 13th meeting of the Consultative Committee of the National Board of Revenue.

The Finance Minister sought suggestions from the

private sector on how this additional amount could be taxed in a rational revenue

### 14 more die of diarrhoea in southern districts

for fast spread of the disease. At least 14 people died of diarrhoea Saturday in three southern districts of Barisal, Patuakhali and Bhola where the disease is spreading fast, according to Health Control

Room here, reports UNB. Of the 14 dead, six were in Barisal, five in Patuakhali and three in Bhola where a total of 655 people were attacked by the disease (Saturday). About 250 medical teams are working in the three districts to combat the disease.

Sit-in demonstration of female peasants in front of the National Press Club in the city

Unofficial sources, however, said more than 20 people died in five southern districts during the 24 hours ending Saturday evening.

A high-level meeting at the Prime Minister's secretariat Saturday reviewed the situation and decided that the control room will identify problems in the affected areas and take immediate steps against spread of the disease.

Officials in the Health Directorate said 96 people died out of 4,869 people attacked by diarrhoea in Barisal, Patuakhali, Bhola, Barguna and Pirojepur since March 21.

Scarcity of pure drinking water was the main reason attributed by the health officials

People in the region are used to take water from canals which have high concentration of diarrhoea bacteria released from hanging latrines on both sides of the canals, officials

Reports from the affected areas said a substantial number of tubewells were either out of order or fail to pump out water as the ground water level sub-

Officials said the meeting at the Prime Minister's Secretariat decided to further strengthen the existing control room to coordinate the activities of the Health Minis try and the local government division at grass root level in order to gear up the monitoring system to combat the disease throughout the

The meeting directed the authorities concerned to ensure supply of necessary medicines and pure drinking water in the affected areas. It also directed the Public Health Engineering Department to complete the sinking of tubewells allotted for the current year by April 30.

#### Govt to appeal against HC judgement on trial body

The government will appeal to the Supreme Court against the judgement of the High Court that directed the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (CMM) to grant anticipatory bail to the 24 sponsors of the people's court, a well-placed government source informed.

A petition on behalf of the government would be moved in the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court after the verdict of a two-member High Court Division Bench is officially recorded and forwarded to the CMM Court, the source said on condition of anonymity. The Division Bench of the

High Court comprising Justice Anwarul Haq and Justice MA Karim gave its judgement on March 31 after a two-day hearing of a petition moved by the 24 persons. The High Court, applying its

inherent power, ordered the CMM Court to grant bail to the 24, after their formal surrender in the court, until the hearing of the case ends.

The CMM Court has no jurisdiction to grant bail on charges relating to sedition See Page 12 Col 7
