

Priority on electronics stressed

Education Minister Barrister Zamiruddin Sircar Thursday underscored the need for giving top priority on advancement in electronics for overall national development, reports BSS.

He said both the government and the non-government organisations should be more active in developing knowledge base and setting up electronic industries in the country.

He was speaking as the chief guest at the inaugural session of the day-long annual conference of Bangladesh Electronics Society held at the Bangladesh Agricultural Research Council (BARC) auditorium in the city.

President of Bangladesh Academy of Sciences Prof M Innaas Ali was the special guest. Presided over by the society President Prof M Shamsul Huq the inaugural session was also addressed by the Vice-President of the society Prof Syed Fazley Rahman and General Secretary M Emdad Hossain.

The Education Minister emphasised the need for an appropriate technology planning so that electronic products could be made cheaper to meet the requirements of the people.

Referring to the demands of the society he assured to consider them sympathetically.

Prof Innaas Ali said there was a large scientific and technical manpower in electronics sector available in the country.

2,08,750 Rohingyas enter

A total of 2,08,750 Rohingyas Muslims have crossed into Bangladesh from the four townships of Arakan province in Burma till Wednesday, according to an official count, reports UNB.

Some 104,580 Rohingyas have been evicted from Mangdam, 89,082 from Buthidang, 8,945 from Rathedang and 7,143 from Sitave townships in Arakan, officials said here Thursday quoting information trickling into the country.

They said 117,461 refugees have been sheltered in 12 camps while 91,289 others are living under the open sky. A new camp is being set up at Nayapara.

Parties condemn UN move against Libya

The United Nations' sanctions against Libya were stated by different socio-political organisations of the city on Thursday.

Freedom Party brought out a procession in the city in protest against the UN action and handed over a memorandum to Biman Bangladesh Airlines authorities to continue its flights to Tripoli.

The memorandum said the flights should continue as about 50,000 Bangladeshis work in Libya.

Bangladesh Samajtantrik Dal (BSD) also held a rally in the city and said the UN is serving the interest of US under the slogan of world peace.

BSD also demanded the withdrawal of the sanctions.

The President and General Secretary of Samajtantrik Chhatra Front, Belal Choudhury and Rajekuzzaman respectively in a joint statement also condemned the UN sanction and demanded withdrawal of the same.

Other organisations which condemned the UN move and demanded its withdrawal are Bangladesh Libya Brotherhood Association, Jatiya Janata Party and Bangladesh Jana Parishad.

Japanese team calls on Hasina

The visiting Japanese Parliamentary delegation led by Shin Sakurai, MP of the House of Representatives and Chairman of the Cabinet Committee called on Awami League President and Leader of the Opposition Sheikh Hasina at her office Thursday, reports BSS.

Deputy Leader of the Opposition, Abdus Samad Azad, Japanese Ambassador, Tohio Saiki and Abul Hasan Choudhury, MP were present.

They discussed overall economic, political and social affairs of Bangladesh. Sakurai appreciated the new economic policy of Bangladesh Awami League. They also gave assurance of their cooperation in increasing the production of jute and foodgrains in Bangladesh.

125 sub-judge courts shifted to district HQs

State Minister for Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Barrister Aminul Haq told the Jatiya Sangsad Thursday that out of 460 upazila sub-judge courts 125 have already been shifted to district headquarters, reports BSS.

Replying to a question from Salahuddin Kamran (BNP-Noakhali), the State Minister said the process of shifting the upazila courts to the district headquarters would be completed soon.

He said the process was being delayed only because of shortage of space in the district headquarters.

Referring to separation of judiciary from the executive, he said a draft bill has already been placed in the House in this regard. The bill was now under consideration in the Parliamentary Standing Committee, he added.

The government was also considering rehabilitation of the 'Choukt Courts' of the British period, he said.

In Mymensingh with the assistance from The Rotary Foundation of about five crore taka are other examples of projects pertaining to food and livestock production and to improve quality of life and self-respect.

The project for "Manually Operated Shallow Tubewells for Irrigation" by Rotary has contributed much in improving the lot of farmers in the country.

To wipe out the disease of poliomyelitis, The Rotary Foundation has supplied polio vaccines to the EPI programme in Bangladesh worth more than 26 crore taka through the UNICEF. This is a milestone in Rotary service in Bangladesh in a single programme.

Cancer Detection Unit and Medical Information Centre at Dhaka are also major breakthroughs in Rotary service in Bangladesh.

Rotary in Bangladesh organises eye and dental camps every year. Only through Rotary, more than 27,000 cataract operations in average are performed every year in the country involving a fund of more than 50 lakh taka.

In the Scholarship, Group Study Exchange, and Youth Exchange programmes, the non-Rotarian young people of Bangladesh get opportunity and benefit of average 50 lakh taka every year by going abroad for study.

In addition to these projects, during emergencies, because of natural calamities, Rotary in Bangladesh has come forward with assistance to embark upon relief and rehabilitation projects either individually or some time by supplementing the government programme.

Rotary in early seventies, built three cyclone-cum-rehabilitation shelters in the coastal areas of the country. This year also Rotary in Bangladesh has spent more than 50 lakhs for the relief and immediate rehabilitation of cyclone and tidal bore affected people in the coastal and off-shore areas. At the same time, Rotary has also planned to have a long term rehabilitation programme involving more than 50 lakhs taka in the country.

In a nutshell, Rotarians and the Rotary families in Bangladesh are always at service to humanity to improve the lot of the common people. Let the Almighty bless us all in our efforts to do so.
