Lack of diesel leads loadshedding in Rajshahi

RAJSHAHI, Apr 19: Lack of diesel and lubricant has forced the only power generating plant of the district at Katakhal inoperative for the last 10 days leading into serious loadshedding in the area, reports UNB.

Sources at the power station said delayed requisition of oil and petroleum to the supplying company has resulted the crisis.

Rejoinder

Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (WASA) issued a rejoinder on the report published in The Daily Star on April 4 under the headline 'WASA's dilemma over site for water works' and clarified five points of the report.

The WASA said that Prof S I Solomon of Waterloo University, Canada and Prof T R E Chidley were engaged by the World Bank under financial assistance of UNDP to survey the Demra site when Harza Engineering Company suggested that the availability of water of the river Sitlaksha would be affected. It said that M/S Camp Dresser and McKee along with other associates was the consultant of the Demra project not the surveying company as mentioned in the report. WASA, however, admitted that the study of Solomon and Chidley differed with Harza Engineering.

WASA's second point was the World Bank did not abandon the project, it is just shifted to the new site.

The third point was the French government was conducting a separate study to meet total water requirement of Dhaka city by the year 2020, which would not only 'Develop the capital's water supply system' as reported.

The fourth clarification was that the total cost of third project (with expansion) was Taka one hundred eighty six crore sixty two lakh and sixty thousand only, not one crore thirty lakh as reported.

The number of deep tube wells of the WASA around the city are 154 not 151 according to the report including 60 of the crash programme.

Five-nation regional Rotary confce ends
Economic cooperation among S Asian states sought

A five-nation regional Rotary conference ended here Sunday urging the South Asian governments to relax visa and travel regulations as a step to promote economic cooperation, reports UNB.

Economic cooperation was a major subject of the three-day meet that brought together more than 700 Rotarians from Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Nepal and Sri Lanka to discuss ways to promote goodwill and cooperation in the region.

The conference, presided over by Rotary International President Rajendra Saboo, also discussed promotional, functional literary, youth and women development and preservation of environment.

A conference resolution said the region of 1 billion people has great potential for economic development through cooperation. People-to-

people contact is what the region needs most.

Discussing women's role for building a prosperous future, the conference underlined the need for making financial credit more accessible to poor rural women.

In her key-note speech on women, Dr Sadia Chowdhury, head of BRAC's Public Health Programme, said Bangladeshi rural women had proved more efficient than men in productive use of credit. They have also a good record in savings.

Referring to the schooling programme of BRAC (Bangladesh Rural Advancement Committee), Dr Chowdhury said 75 per cent of BRAC's 1.8 lakh students in 6,000 schools are girls. The dropout rate in BRAC-run schools is only 1 to 2 compared with 25 per cent in government-run primary schools.

The plight of the Rohingya

Muslim refugees generated sympathy among the Rotarians who raised Tk 20 lakh in aid of the displaced people in response to a call by Rotary International President Saboo. More donations from Rotarians in other regions are expected.

The conference decided to set up a South Asian Rotary Centre of Cooperation to coordinate the development and social welfare projects of Rotary Clubs in the region. The site of the proposed centre has not been selected.

In his concluding remarks, Saboo said he hoped to raise a joint cultural group of South Asian Rotary Clubs which will tour other regions.

Governor of the Bangladesh chapter of Rotary International Prof Jalal U Ahmad, eminent Rotarians Iftekhar Alam and Habibullah Khan also spoke at the concluding ceremony.

'Reduce rate of heart diseases through social prevention'

Deputy Leader in Parliament Dr A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury Sunday emphasised on the importance of taking up social preventive measures to combat the increasing menace of heart diseases, reports UNB.

Dr Badruddoza said that heart diseases could be minimised through taking up measures for "social prevention" rather than medical prevention.

He was addressing a discussion on "Heart Disease and its Social Prevention" at the National Institute for Prevention of Social Medicine (NIPSON) at Mohakhali Health Complex.

Voluntary Health Services Society (VHSS) and National Anti Tuberculosis Association of Bangladesh (NATAB) jointly arranged the discussion in observance of the World Health Day.

Referring to successful health management of neighbouring Sri Lanka, Badruddoza said that the country had ensured healthcare to its people through ensuring supply of pure drinking water and a disease prevention system.

He said that Sri Lanka made its health management system effective and successful mainly because of its mass literacy of about 90 per cent.

Sri Lanka, with its per capita income of 450 US dollar, has achieved much more success in healthcare than the Middle-Eastern countries with their per capita income of 10,000 US dollar.

Badruddoza said that Bangladesh can also achieve success in reducing the rate of heart diseases through concerted efforts of the government and NGOs. He mentioned that due to concerted efforts the country successfully eradicated

small pox and many other diseases.

Low income group poor people mainly suffers from rheumatic heart diseases due to unhygienic living conditions in the slum areas while the richer class suffers from coronary heart diseases mainly due to intake of cholesterol food-stuff.

He called upon the people to get aware of the rheumatic fever and take action well in advance. Patients of high blood pressure and diabetes have much chances of getting heart diseases and so people crossing 40 should be cautious and people in their 30s should be aware of the disease.

Presided over by NATAB Secretary General Dr Sakawat Hossain, the discussion was also addressed by Dilwar Ali Khan of UNICEF and Roushan Rahman of VHSS.
