**Be united to tackle environment problems: Huda to S Asian states**

Information Minister Nazmul Huda Wednesday underscored the need for joint actions by the South-Asian nations to tackle their environmental problems because such problems did not have any international boundaries, reports BSS.

Addressing the concluding session of the five-day workshop on 'Environmental reporting in South Asia' at a city hotel, the Minister hoped that people's participation at the level of planning and implementation of projects would help resolve the problems which have caused great concern in the region.

Huda said the extraordinary ecological diversity of the region - ranging from high mountain temperature forests of the Himalayas to the tropical forests of Bangladesh, India, Nepal and Bhutan - gave rise to an extraordinary cultural diversity which embodied within its rich traditions of ecological management and resource use.

The workshop was jointly organised by AMIC-Singapore and the Asia Foundation, Dhaka in coordination with Devfeature.

It was participated in by journalists from Bangladesh, India, Nepal, the Maldives and Sri Lanka. Dr Victor Valbuena, Coordinator, AMIC, Singapore, also spoke on the occasion.

Touching on some environmental issues of Bangladesh, Huda said children and women were dying in thousands every year in the country due to polluted drinking water.

Explaining the reasons, he said it was only poverty which caused the deaths. Bangladesh experiences 79 million diarrhoeal episodes in children under 5 years of age and 3 lakh children die due to diarrhoea, he said.

The Information Minister said children were the most vulnerable in the environmental problems, although, he pointed out, many environmentalists did not take the children dying in thousands every year, into consideration.

Referring to the recurrent floods, Huda said the floods not only threaten economy and development but also cause environmental and ecological problems. He said floods have caused enough misery to the people, but Bangladesh believes that this problem could be resolved at the regional level.

Mr Huda said Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia has urged the implementation agency responsible for flood action plan to get involve people's participation in the planning. He said Bangladesh has initiated a regional water resource management plan with its South Asian neighbours - India, Nepal and Bhutan - where the headwaters originated. He said this plan would lessen the impacts of the flood during the monsoon as well as augment water flow during the dry season.

**BNP breaches Joint Declaration: CPB**

Blind cult of Marxism, hypnotic allegiance to communist parties by its members, stagnant non-contextual policies and turning communist parties into governments in different states knocked communism out to a 'temporary' end in Russia and East Europe.

This was stated by Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) leaders in observance of the 122nd birth anniversary of V I Lenin Wednesday. They pointed that while Lenin accepted criticism, new ideas and reforms, his successors were virtually fanatic about communism for which the fall had become inevitable.

CPB General Secretary, Nurul Islam Nahid who chaired the meeting, said Lenin always emphasised on the analysis of the realities of one's respective society and expressed his opinion that Bangladesh should also give the first priority to the present reality of the country.

He said the country at present was in midst of several crises and called for unity among all parties to solve some national issues. He said: 'We had stood unitedly against Ershad, we unitedly formed the present government structure and we can solve our national problems unitedly.'
