

A pedestrian, Abdul Malek, 50, was killed while a truck crushed him at around 11:30 am at Narsingdi. He was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) and succumbed to his injuries there at about 5 pm.

Railway police recovered the body of an unidentified teenaged girl near Probhatt Sharani at Dhaka Cantonment at around 9:30 am. Railway police said that the girl was run over by a speeding train in the morning. A UNB report adds: Two

people, a father and his young son, were killed and three others of the same family seriously injured when a minibus hit a private car at Master Bari area of Gazipur on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway. Witnesses and police said

the accident occurred when the Mymensingh bound minibus (Momenshahi BA-309) coming from Dhaka hit a private car (Dhaka Gha-5063) coming from the same direction at 9 am. The minibus, while trying
