A five-day aquartum (ornamental) fish exhibition was opened in Dhaka at the National Museum Saturday morning with Environment, Forest, Pisheries and Livestock Minister Abdullah al Noman under scoring the need for making the aquarium culture a profitable industry, reports

TOKYO, Apr 25: A businessman admitted at a pretrial hearing Friday that he bribed a former cabinet minister who was a close ally of Prime Minister Kiichi Miyazawa, reports AP.

Goro Moriguchi, a former Vice-President of Kyowa Co, a steel-frame maker, admitted that he gave 90 million yen (669,000 dollar) in bribes to Fumio Abe, a former official of Miyazawa's faction in the governing party, court officials

Prosecutors charge that Moriguchi gave the alleged bribes to Abe in return for favors while Abe headed the Hokkaido Development Agency in 1990.

They say Abe had demanded money from Moriguchi, including 10 million yen (74,300 dollar) to remodel his apartment and purchase new furniture.

In response to the prosecutors' charges read by Judge Masaru Tsuda, Moriguchi answered. "That's correct," the officials said.

The Abe case and a separate scandal, in which many powerful politicians reportedly received questionable contributions from a mob-tainted trucking company have embarrassed Miyazawa's administration and resulted in increased pressure for reforms to reduce legislators' dependence on corporate donations.
