### \$ 1.881m IDB grant for Rohingyas

The Islamic Development Bank (IDB) has approved a grant of 1.881 million dollars for Myanmar Muslim refugees in Bangladesh, official sources said here Saturday, reports BSS.

The approval was given at a meeting of the Board of Executive Directors of the bank held on April 21.

The grant will be utilised for the construction of camps for the refugees and for providing other urgent facilities such as tubewells, trench latrines and mobile medical services trucks.

Besides, the IDB had contacted a number of relief organisations and other interested organisations in Saudi Arabia such as Islamic International Relief Agency, Jeddah and Rabeta Al-Alam Al Islami Makka Al Mokarram to mobilise more help for the refugees. The bank will coordinate with these organisations and cooperate with them to maximise the help for the Myanmar Muslim refugees in Bangladesh.

Prior to his departure for Chittagong Airport he told that all members of his community were living in peace and happiness in Bangladesh and that he was very happy for the same.

He presented a cheque for Taka five lakh to Chittagong City Corporation Mayor for the welfare of the orphans.

## 90 pc rural children anaemic, 30,000 become blind a year

Prof A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury Sunday underscored the need for dedication by the educated people working with the government as well as the NGOs to overcome the problems faced by the children, reports BSS.

He said the people should be given the proper knowledge of health and nutrition so that they could provide necessary care and nutrition to the children with the limited resources available to them.

Prof Chowdhury, the Deputy Leader of the Jatiya Sangsad, was speaking as the chief guest at a seminar on "We Are For the Children" organised by the Rotaract Club of Sir Salimullah Medical College (SSMC) on behalf of Rotaract District 3280 at the Prof Ibrahim Diabetic Hospital Auditorium in the city.

He said 90 per cent rural children were anaemic and 30,000 children were getting blind each year for want of iron and vitamin respectively. But our 'Lal Shak, Kachu Shak and Data Shak' have plenty of iron and vitamin and could meet the needs of the children.

Referring to stoppage of child labour, he said strong political will was needed to do that.

He said the children should be given life oriented education so that they could sustain it. He also said that the children should be taught social values and the females should be given priority in all sorts of education.

Prof Jalal Ahmed said Rotary Club was working to eradicate polio from the world by the year 2000. And it has donated polio vaccines worth Taka 30 crore to Bangladesh through the UNICEF. Now they are concentrating on functional literacy where within four months one could learn the three R's.

Prof Majid said those, who could afford to feed more children, were following the principle of planned parenthood. But the poor were not following that principle. They should be motivated in this direction through creation of awareness, he added.

Prof Ferdous Ara suggested to be vocal against child labour and repression on children. She said congenial atmosphere was needed for physical and mental growth of a child.

Prof F H Nazir said 65 per cent of the child diseases could be prevented if the knowledge of health, nutrition and sanitation could be applied. Illiteracy is the main obstacle to it, he added.

### BSTI files 11 cases against filling stations

A Mobile Court led by metropolitan Magistrate Hasanur Rahman was conducted Sunday by Bangladesh Standards and Testing Institution against uses of illegal weight and measurement at Mirpur road, Elephant road, Government New Market and Chandichalk Market and several filling stations, reports BSS.

The court instituted 11 cases against filling stations, 25 cases against jewellery shops and three against cloth shops for deceiving people in weight and measurement.

### WB assistance in population sector assured

A population specialist team of World Bank Population and Human Resources division led by S K Sudha Kar called on Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal ibne Yusuf at the latter's Secretariat office Sunday, reports BSS.

They discussed matters of several issues of population sector involving World Bank operation in Bangladesh.

The Health Minister apprised the World Bank team that steps had been taken by the government to execute the 4th population and health project.

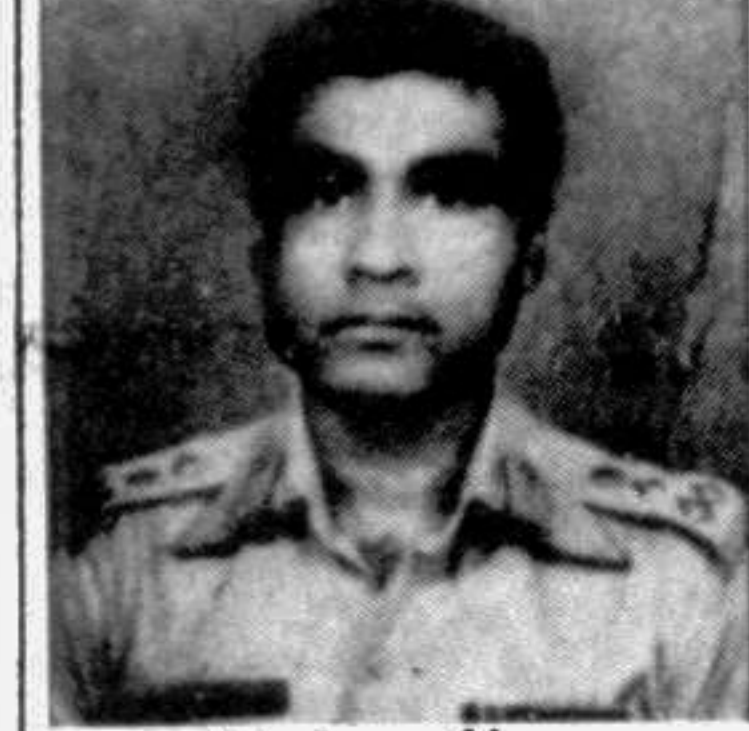

## Tk 203 cr rly workshop near completion

The construction of Bangladesh Railway's Central Locomotive workshop at a cost of Taka 203 crore at the northern railway town of Parbatpur is near completion and is likely to be formally inaugurated by the middle of May, reports BSS.

State Minister for Communications Fazlur Rahman, who visited the under-construction workshop Saturday, was informed that when fully operative, the workshop would be able to carry major overhauling of ten rail engines every month. This would help ensure availability of engines to a great extent, and smoother train movement.

This is the only workshop of its kind in the country for which Saudi Arabia through Saudi Development Fund has provided Taka 106 crore in foreign exchange.
