KARACHI, Apr 27 : Pakistan is waiting for India's reply on playing in the Asia Cup cricket tournament scheduled for here in October, the secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in Pakistan (BCCP) said Monday, reports AFP.

Shahid Rafi said, "The game of cricket between Pakistan and India has always generated tremendous interest and we are anxiously looking forward to fulfilment of India's obliga tion to play the Asia Cup at Karacht in October.

He said the Asian Cricket Council in its meeting at Sharjah had decided India was obligated to come.

As for former Indian captain Sunil Gavaskar's remarks that he would like to see the two countries resume Test series, Rafi said he was "encouraged by such statements, although we have not yet received any official invitation in this regard."

Gavaskar, in Pakistan to participate in a special ceremony to honour the World Cup-winning Pakistan team, also said officials of the cricket boards of the two countries were likely to meet next month to work out details. Rafi declined to either con-

firms or deny the statement India came to Pakistan on an almost six-week tour in 1989-90, drawing the four-

Test series.

The following year Pakistan was to visit India but the tour was called off amid a religious controversy in India which pitched Hindus and Muslims against each other India is predominantly Hindu, while Pakista is predominantly Muslim.
