

LONDON, Apr 28: This year's Wimbledon tennis champions will receive record rewards for their efforts the All England Club announced today, reports Reuter.

Total prize money has been increased by 10 per cent to 4,416,820 pounds sterling (7.83 million dollar). The men's champion will win 2,65,000 pounds (4,69,700), compared with the 2,40,000 pounds (4,25,400) collected by Michael Stich in 1991, while the winner of the women's singles will now receive 2,40,000 pounds (4,25,400 dollar).

John Curry, chairman of the All England Club and committee of management, said the increase reflected the pound's slide against the dollar over the last 12 months.

"When deciding the level of prize money we have to take into account international exchange rates. Wimbledon is an international tournament with a substantial number of competitors based overseas."

JOHANNESBURG Apr 28 : India's tour of South Africa later this year, the first by any official side
