CANTERBURY, England, May 5: Pakistan batsman Salim Malik banished painful memories of his

disappointing World Cup form on Monday by hitting his second impressive half-century in 24 hours, reports Reuter.

Malik played a high quality innings of 95 in a one-day match against Kent to follow his fluent 84 when Pakistan beat the Duchess of Norfolk's XI in the opening tour fixture at Arundel on Sounday.

Captaining Pakistan while Javed Miandad rested, Malik led his side to a 40-run victory, the touring team making 281 for six in their quota of 55 overs and dismissing Kent for 241 with seven overs left.

Malik, who reached his 50 in 75 balls, faced 111 deliveries altogether in a graceful innings and put on 129 in 24 overs for the fifth wicket with Asif Mujtaba, who hit and unbeaten 69.

They capitalised on the flying start provided by opener Aamir Schail (37) Inzamam Ul-Haq (40).


LONDON, May 5 : Olympic silver medallist Linford Christie will captain Britain's men's athletics team at this year's Barcelona Games the British Athletic Federation (BAF) said on Monday, Reuter.

Christie, 32, has captained the men's team since 1989 and is once against expected to head the European challenge to American supremacy in the 100 metres.

He was awarded a silver medal behind American Carl Lewis in Seoul four years ago after the disqualification of Canadian winner Ben Johnson for doping.



Hendry snookers White again



SHEFFIELD, England, May 5: Scotland's Stephen Hendry staged a remarkable recovery to win

the last 10 frames and snatch the World Snooker Championship for the second time on Sunday, reports Reuter.

Hendry, who began the second day of the final trailing England's Jimmy White 6-10 and fell even further behind to be 8-14 down, reeled off the next 10 frames to take

12 attempts at the title and the second time he had been beaten at the final hurdle by the 23-year-old Scot, who picked up a cheque for 150,000 pounds sterling

(dollar 267,000).

White won 90,000 pounds (dollar 160,000) but had the consolation of having picked up 114,000 pounds (dollar 203,000) for making a maximum 147 break earlier in the tournament. "I've never played better,"

said Hendry afterwards. "It was the kind of match where if you made one mistake you were punished for it." White, putting on a brave

face, said: "Stephen played fantastic snooker. I felt good all the way through the final and I still feel good now." Hendry produced a thrilling

fightback worthy of his world number one status.

It all started to go wrong for White in the 23rd frame. Up 28-0 early on, the world nubmer three flashed at a long red and let Hendry in for a 35 clearance to the pink. The Scot also came from behind in each of the next four frames.

Hendry was on a high, while White could only sit and wonder what had gone wrong Back-to-back centuries of 134 and 112 -taking his haul in the final to four - completed the recovery. "It was just incredible re-

ally," said Hendry. "The first two frames of the night could have gone either way. Fortunately for me, I won them and from then on I played some of the best snooker of my life."

BUENOS AIRES, May 5 The Argentine soccer derby between First Division leaders Boca Juniors and River Plate netted an Argentine record .65 million dollars in ticket sales, reports Reuter.
