Ogo Pothero Shathi, Nomi Barongbar!

Where the mind is without fear and the head is held high, - into that heaven of free dom, let my country awake'

The Bengali will recall, yet again, in his own, individual, humble way, one of the greatest poets of his language, on his 131st birthday. On 25th of Baishakh 131 years ago, the star rose on the Bengali language and nation, with the birth of the immortal Rabindranath Tagore. He is gone; as we must all go, but, is immortalized in his songs and his writings, for his nation, of

whom he was so passionately fond. He had rightly predicted, 'my nation will remember me, always, through my songs, a prediction which still holds true, so many years later and had prompted Ezra Pound to "Tagore has sung Bengal into a na-

The Bengalt has sung Tagore's songs, acted out his plays, laughed and cried with the heroes and heroines of his incomparable novels and short stories and danced

to music composed on his songs. Every year, on the appointed day, his people gather, humbly, to pay respect to him, who had given them an identity all their own. This man, had won for the Bengali, the Nobel Prize for literature at a time, when the British were at the zenith of their power, and for the Nobel Prize, to be won by a man other than white, was an unthinkable proposition. But then, Tagore had always made the unthinkable, thinkable, for the Bengali. Although at times, perhaps unthinkingly accused of being an armchair idealist, he was obviously far from that; his love of children and his faith in them, his love for his people, proved over

and over again, his capacity to do whatever he did, with all his energy and being. And it is this love for his people which they in turn, have remembered him by.

The 25th day of the month of Baishakh, is a landmark in the lives of his nation, his beloved people. Tagore never professed to be a genius with unrivalled patience and persistence. Each violent storm, on the personal or national level, left the great man, wiser and sadder. It is a lesson, which his nation tries to learn from

him. As we celebrate the birthday of Tagore, we cannot help but recall, that his patriotic songs, were an inspiration for the national struggle, and continue to inspire us now, as it did then. His devotional songs, move us to tears, his songs on nature, make nature not only a background but a participant, his love songs turn us all into lovers. He coaxes the best out of us and leaves us wiser, perhaps a little sadder at our inadequacies. And

yet, his sensibility, rooted so deeply in his lyrics, teaches us, that it is impossible, to ignore our heritage. It shows us that it is the culture of our land, which makes us reluctant to take sides in the battle which each new generation renews. And as we renew our pledge to honour the great poet, we renew our pledge to honour ourselves, to delight in life itself. Only then can we enjoy the beauty and the tragedies of life and live it fully. And resist succumbing to poverty of spirit, to continue to love and to forgive and in remembering him, recall 'All humanity's greatest is mine".


