1500 Rohingyas arrive Friday

About 1,500 more refugees from Myanmar arrived Friday making the total to 2,45,531. officials said, reports UNB.

Arrival of refugees on an av erage 1,000 every day despite Dhaka and Rangoon reached agreements on repatriation of the refugees raised doubts in political circles about the efficacy of the accords.

Continuous influx of refu gees from Myanmar indicate that persecution of the Musitms has been going unabated.

Agreement on repatriation of the refugees was signed between the two countries envisaging repatriation will start not later than May 15 and a batch of 5000 refugees will go back every alternate day.

Of the total refugees 1,66,257 are living in 12 camps while 79,274 are passing their days under the open sky, officials said.


