Pakistan lose by 5 wickets

WORCESTER, May 8: Pakistan slumped to a fivewicket defeat against Worcestershire Friday in the debut first-class match of

its four-month English tour. Worcestershire's pace bowler Phil Newport ripped ithrough Pakistan's middle and tail-order, taking five wickets for eight runs from 36 deliveries, forcing Pakistan to close its second inning at 93 for

Pakistan appeared to control the match after declaring Wednesday at 374 for four, including 172 to Rameez Raja, and Worcestershire declared at five for 303 Thursday.

But Pakistan was immediately in trouble on Friday's final day after resuming at 31 for two. All-rounder Philip Weston had Pakistan acting captain Salim Malik caught for seven to start the collapse.

Newport, a 29-year-old who has played two Tests for England, then took five wickets with only opener Shoaib Mohammad on 46 managing a decent score.

Inzamam-ul-Hug went for seven, Wasim Akram for four, Rashid Latif for two, Mushtaq Ahmed for four and Aagib Javed for a duck.

With Asif Mujtaba unable to bat after injuring his hand fielding Wednesday, Pakistan had to close its innings at 93 for nine with Salim Jaafar not out one.

Newport was selected for England after taking 10 Australian wickets in 1989 when the home team wrapped up the game in less than two

Later Friday, in the other quarterfinals, Amanda Coetzer of South Africa faced Natalia Zvereva of Russia and Anke Huber of Germany played Mary Joe Fernandez of the United States in an evening encounter.

It was the third relatively easy victory at the clay-court event for Seles, who lost to Sabatini in last year's final.

"All the matches till now were pretty easy, but I have not played great. I will have to improve a lot in the next matches," said Seles, who has not lost a set all week.

Seles had won her three previous matches against Meskhi, but the Georgian took Seles to three sets at the Australian Open in January.

But Meskhi seemed to have no chance to get into the match Friday, as Seles pounded two-fisted groundstrokes consistently down the lines, her opponent in futile crosscourt pursuits.

After winning the first set

in 30 minutes, Seles appeared to slow and lose concentration at times, but was never threatened.





The 1992 Lola-Euick V6 from Team Menard appeared to be solidly in the racing groove before the rear end suddenly slipped to the left, sending Piquet on a fast looping spin into the outside concrete wall nearly head-on.

A slow-motion videotape replay appeared to show an unidentified metal piece flying from the rear of the car just moments before he entered the turn and lost control.


